Home/School communication and collaboration are important for student success. I want to thank all families who attended conferences or will be this week. Your dedication to forming a relationship with your child's school and teacher is important!

Seven Ways to assure success at Parent/Guardian-teacher conferences
The National Education Association suggests these tips for better Parent/Guardian-Teacher
conferences:

- Write yourself notes, before the conference, about important topics to cover. You might want the teacher to know about your child's home life, personality, problems, habits, or hobbies.
- Ask your children what they would like you to talk about with their teachers. Also, ask your children
 what they think are their best and worst subjects, and have them explain why.
- Stay calm during the conference.
 - Ask for an explanation if the teacher uses an unfamiliar term
- or talks about something that you don't understand.
- Ask important questions first in case you run out of time.
- Try to ask such questions as; is my child in different groups
- for different subjects? Why? What are his/her best and worst subjects? Is my child working up to his/her ability? Does my child participate in class discussions and activities? Has my child missed any classes other than the ones I contacted the

school about? What kinds of tests are being done? What do they tell about my child's progress? How well does my child handle taking tests?

• Find out specific ways that you can help your child perform better in school. At home, discuss these strategies with your child and let him/her know that you and the teacher care about what happens. Then, start working on your plan immediately. Finally, remember to follow up with the teacher to discuss your child's progress.

This was part of the Earth's Changes unit and the processes that change the Earth's surface. We focused on different types of landforms on Earth and whether they are caused by slow or fast events.

It was a challenge learning a new language but it did smell delicious as the students pressed in gingerbread dough.


All the students had a blast working on their projects and learned so much. Ask your student what their favorite part was.
