I am sharing important information about the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This federal law provides funding to our school district to support equal educational opportunities for all students, especially those from low-income backgrounds.

The ESEA provides grant funds to our school district, RSU #38, to support various educational programs and initiatives. These funds are used to provide intervention for students who need additional support to meet academic standards in the elementary grades eligible for Title I services. The funds also support professional development for our teachers and staff from Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade to help increase student achievement.

The Maine Department of Education (DOE) has created an ESEA Data Dashboard (https://www.maine.gov/doe/dashboard) that allows you to view information about our district and statewide data on various aspects of education, such as student achievement, school performance, per-pupil spending, educator qualifications, graduation rates, and other relevant indicators.
