As part of our on-going effort to provide excellent health services to our students, families, faculty, and staff, FPS, in cooperation with the Arkansas Department of Education Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, has implemented the Coordinated School Health Initiative.

Following The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child Model, Fayetteville Public Schools emphasizes the relationship between educational attainment and health, by putting the child at the center of a system designed to support both. Research shows that the health of students is linked to their academic achievement. Through partnerships with health agencies, parents, and community members who support the health and academic achievement of our students, we can build a healthy, safe, engaging, supportive, and encouraging learning environment.
