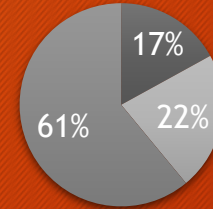

Days Attended A+ After-School/Spring/Summer Programs

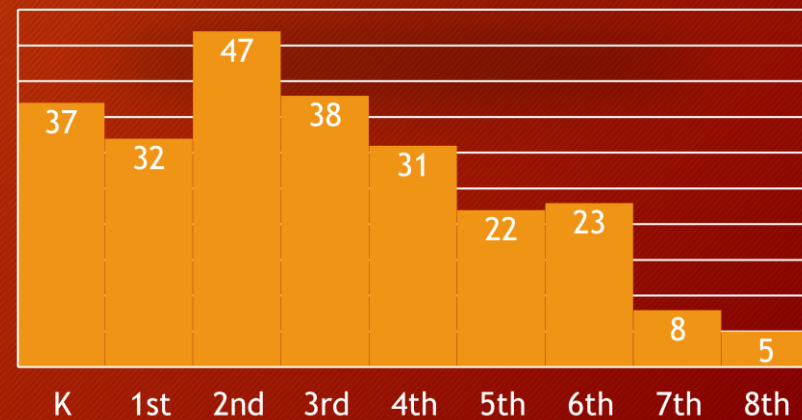


■ less than 30 days ■ 30- 90 days ■ 90-179 days

PARENT SURVEYS:

76% return rate

100% of families believe Staff and program leaders care about their child

97% of families believe that A+ Staff have built positive relationships with their child

98% of families feel they communicate with staff and leaders about concerns they may have

96% of families feel that because of their interaction with A+ program staff, they feel more welcomed in the school

The percent of A+ families that agree A+ helped their child:

Get along better with others: 98%

Improve their grades: 95%

Participate in activities they would not otherwise have the opportunity to participate in 97%

Have increased confidence in their abilities 97%

Increase physical activity 95%

Develop new skills/interests 97%

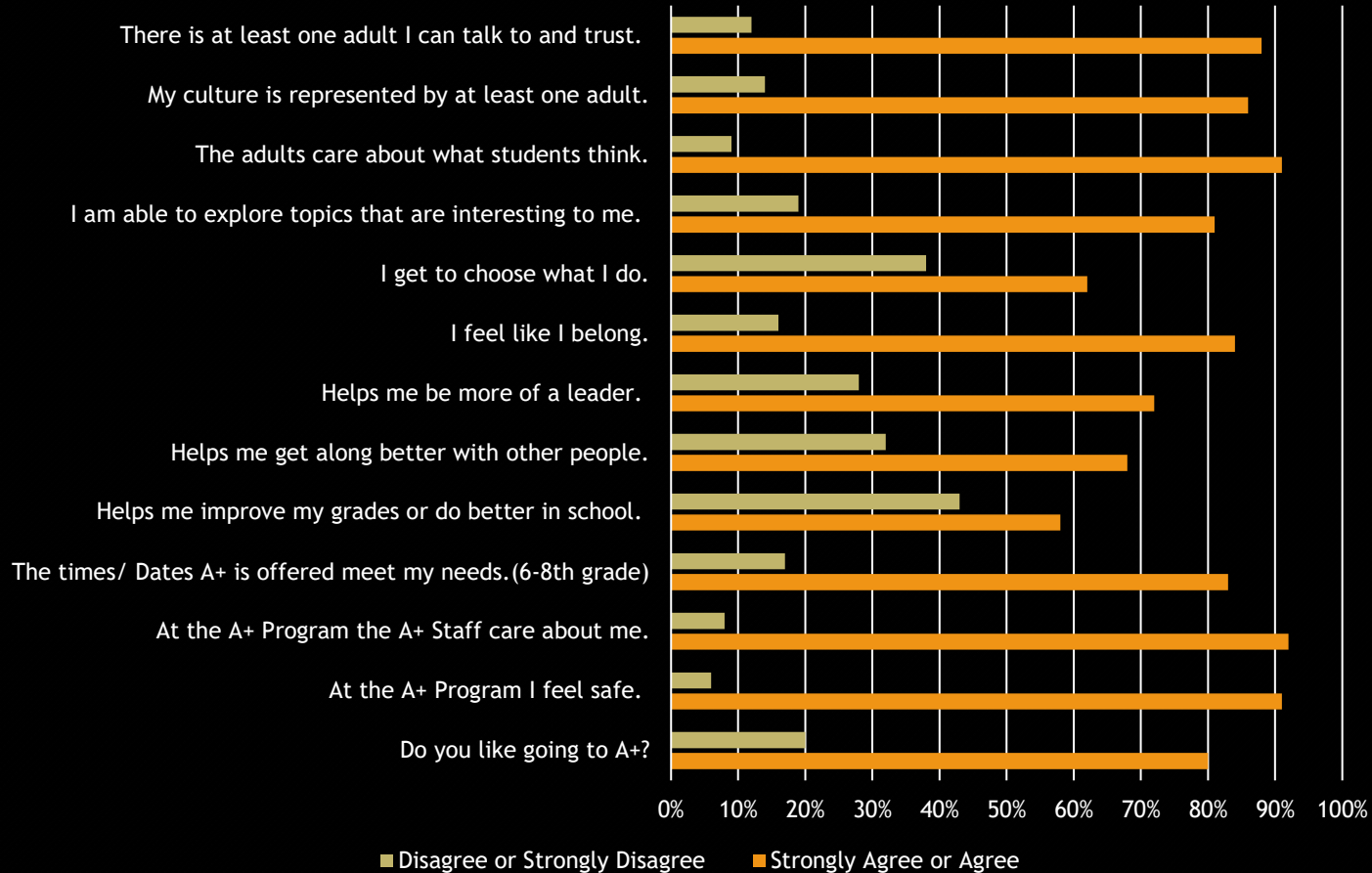
