

# NOTICE OF PESTICIDE APPLICATION

This notice is being provided to you as required by the NJ Integrated Pest Management Act of 2002 to inform you of the planned application of pesticides on school grounds on the first available date as shown in the table below. There will be a posting at the school entrances on the day when the application will occur.

No one will be permitted on the treated grounds for 24 hours after the application.

All Material Safety Data Sheets for the chemicals that will be applied are available for your inspection in the office of the Facilities Director located in the high school and at the middle school facility supervisor's office.

As part of a school pest management plan, Northern Burlington may use pesticides to control pests. The Office of Pesticide Programs of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) register pesticides to determine that the use of a pesticide in accordance with the instructions printed on the label does not pose an unreasonable risk to human health and the environment. Nevertheless, the EPA and the NJDEP cannot guarantee that registered pesticides do not pose any risk to human health, thus unnecessary exposure to pesticides should be avoided. The EPA has issued a statement, "Where possible, persons who potentially are sensitive, such as pregnant women, infants, and children, should avoid any unnecessary pesticide exposure".

**Location of and Reason for pesticide/herbicide application:** Normal annual turf management program of the buildings and grounds department to be applied by licensed district personnel and licensed contractor.

**In the case of an outdoor application, 3 dates must be listed, in chronological order, on which the outdoor application may take place if the preceding date is canceled.**

<b>Post Emergent - Escalade®2</b> -- All middle and high school athletic fields & perimeter lawn areas	<b><u>Sundays:</u></b> One application on the first available date: May 12 <sup>th</sup> , May 19 <sup>th</sup> , June 2 <sup>nd</sup>

**Description of the possible adverse effects of the pesticides as per the Material Safety Data Sheets for the pesticides to be used, if available:**

**Escalade®2** – May cause eye irritation, skin irritation. Harmful if swallowed.

**Barricade 4FL**– In case of skin contact take off all contaminated clothing immediately. Wash off immediately with plenty of water. In case of eye contact rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids for at least 15 minutes. If swallowed, seek medical advice immediately and show container or label.

**Pesticide/Herbicide(s) product-label instructions and precautions related to Public Safety:**

**All products** -- keep spectators away. Avoid breathing dust. **Escalade** products are toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates. Do not apply directly to water. People and pets may enter treated areas after spray has dried.
