




to boost their mental health?". The picture above was created with their responses – we support mental health, there is HOPE!

State End of Course (EOCEP) exams are taken in the following courses: <u>English II</u>, <u>Algebra I</u>, <u>Intermediate Algebra</u>, <u>Biology I</u>, <u>US History</u>, and <u>HIS 202</u>.

The End-of-Course Examination Program (EOCEP) is a statewide assessment program for specific courses awarding units of credit in English/language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies. The exams must be taken to earn credit for the course. Additionally, scores must be counted as 20% of the final grade in the aligned course. EOCEP test items are written to assess the knowledge and skills described in the academic standards. Links to the standards are provided by clicking on the course names above. 
