Illness Reminder:

STUDENT ATTENDANCE



State Board of Education Regulation 43-274 requires students in Kindergarten-12th grade to attend school a minimum of 170 of the 180 school days to receive credit for the academic year. The 10 total absences includes excused or unexcused absences.

Attendance Agreement: All Students Kindergarten-12th Grade

School administration will meet with students and parents when students are in danger of missing too many days, and students will be placed on an attendance agreement. This process will be done to ensure students and parents are aware of the attendance requirements for the school year.

Options for Make-Up: All Students Kindergarten-12th Grade

Students who exceed 10 absences will be required to make up that time by attending after school, Saturday school, and/or summer school to meet the state requirements for attendance.

High School Students Only

Students in grades 9-12 are earning credits toward a high school diploma. The South Carolina Department of Education mandates a seat time requirement to earn credit for each course. When a student misses more than 10 days in a full-credit course and more than 5 days in a half-credit course, there is a requirement to make those classes up or the student will not earn the credit. *Each missed day in a double-blocked course will count as 2 absences (Career Center, Advanced Placement, etc.)

ASISTENCIA DE LOS ESTUDINATES



Regulación de la Junta de Educación del Estado 43-274 requiere que los estudiantes en los grados Kinder-12 asistan a la escuela un mínimo de 170 de los 180 dias escolares para poder recibir crédito del año académico. Las ausencias totales incluyen ausencias justificadas y injustificadas.

Acuerdo de Asistencia: Todos los Estudiantes en los Grados Kinder-12

La administracion de la escuela se reunirá con los estudiantes y los padres cuando los estudiantes esten en peligro de perder demasiados días, y los estudiantes serán colocados en un acuerdo de asistencia. Este proceso se llevara acabo para garantizar que los estudiantes y los padres esten al tanto de los requisitos de asistencia para el año escolar.

Opciones para Recuperar Dias: Todos los Estudiantes en los Grados Kinder-12

Los estudiantes que excedan las 10 ausencias deberán recuperar ese tiempo asistiendo después de la escuela, a la escuela de Sabado y/o a las escuela de verano para cumplir con los requisitos de asistencia.

Solo para Estudiante de Secundaria

Los estudiantes en los grados 9-12 estan obteniendo créditos para obtener un diploma de escuela secundaria. El Departamento de Educacion de Carolina del Sur exige un requisito de tiempo de asiento para poder obtener créditos por cada curso. Cuando un estudiante pierde mas de 10 dias en un curso de crédito completo y mas de 5 dias en un curso de medio crédito, existe el requisito de recuperar esas clases o el estudiante no obtendrá el crédito. *Cada dia perdido en un curso de doble bloqueo contara como 2 ausencias (Centro de Carreras, Colocacion Avanzada, etc.)
