Attendance Matters

Every student. Every day.

Attendance Reminders

- Regular attendance is necessary if students are to make the desired and expected academic progress.
- Please make sure your child is at school before the 7:45 tardy bell rings.
- We cannot dismiss from the office after 2:10 or thirty minutes before dismissal on early release and half days.
- When a student is dismissed early from school, they lose important instruction time.
- Please try to make appointments after the school day ends.
- When a student is absent (Medical, Excused, Unexcused...) at least 10% of the time during which they are enrolled, they are considered Chronically Absent.
- The total number of chronically absent students will be included on district and school report cards.
- Students are only allowed seven excused parent notes per school year.
- A note or medical excuse is required for any absences a student has.

Number of Tardies	Consequence
3	Notify Parent(s)/Guardian(s) by Phone
5	Parent Conference
10	Tardy Intervention Plan Developed
15	Referral to Student Services for Tardy Hearing

Truancy Procedure

After three (3) consecutive or a total of five (5) unlawful absences, school officials will notify the parents to come to the school to develop a Truancy Intervention Plan. (A Case Manager will do a home visit at this time).

If the student accumulates two (2) more unlawful absences after the request for the development of the Intervention Plan, the student will be referred to the Chief Student Services Officer for further actions.
