Antioch American Legion Post # 748, Endowment Fund Scholarship – \$1,000 award for a senior who has at least one ancestor or blood relative who is a war veteran or has had military service. This award must be applied toward advancement of the senior's educational opportunities and is based on financial need. You must include a description of your relationship to the veteran on a separate piece of paper.

#### **Antioch Lions Club Scholarships:**

<u>Academic Scholarship</u> – \$1,000 award to (2) seniors intending to enroll in a 4-year college or university. Applicants must reside in Antioch Township or be children/grandchildren of an Antioch Lion's member. Minimum GPA of 3.0 required.

<u>Andrew Wade Male Sports Person of the Year Scholarship</u> – \$1,000 award to a male senior intending to enroll in a 2- or 4-year college, university or vocational school. Applicants must reside in Antioch Township or be children/grandchildren of an Antioch Lion's member, have participated in athletic activities over four years of high school, and carry a minimum GPA of 3.0.

<u>Female Sports Person of the Year Scholarship</u> – \$1,000 award to female senior intending to enroll in a 2- or 4-year college, university or vocational school. Applicants must reside in Antioch Township or be children/grandchildren of an Antioch Lion's member, have participated in athletic activities over four years of high school, and carry a minimum GPA of 3.0.

<u>Vocational Scholarship</u> – \$1,000 award to (2) seniors intending to enroll in a 2-year college or vocational school. Applicants must reside in Antioch Township or be children/grandchildren of an Antioch Lion's member, have participated in vocational activities over four years of high school, and carry a minimum GPA of 2.0.

<u>Ed Vos Fine Arts Scholarship</u> – \$1,000 award will be given to a student who has been involved in and will continue his/her education in the fine arts.

Antioch Junior Woman's Club Community Scholarship – Antioch Junior Woman's Club will present a \$1,000 scholarship to a District 117 female student planning to attend a 2- or 4-year college or university. Strong consideration given to level of volunteerism, activities, and community service involvement. Additional consideration given to financial need. GPA must be a minimum of 3.0.

Antioch Junior Woman's Club Terry Korom Memorial Scholarship – Antioch Junior Woman's Club will present a \$1,000 scholarship to a District 117 female student planning to attend a 2- or 4-year college or university. Requires student to have held a leadership position in an academic organization. Additional consideration given to financial need. GPA must be a minimum of 3.0.

**Antioch Woman's Club Scholarship** – \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to an Antioch senior planning to earn a degree from the College of Lake County and/or a 4-year college or university.

Antioch Woman's Club Lillie Petty Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000 scholarship for a student from Lakes or Antioch that plans to major in education.

Antioch Woman's Club Dorothy Volkert Memorial Scholarship - \$1,000 scholarship for a student from Lakes or Antioch.

Antioch Woman's Club Vocational Education Scholarship - \$1,000 to a Lakes <u>or</u> Antioch student that plans to study at any vocational school, including the College of Lake County or technology or trade schools.

**APAB (Antioch Performing Arts Boosters) Scholarship** – Two \$500 scholarships or one \$1,000 scholarship (depending on applications received) to students that are members of the performing or visual arts departments. Applicants must be continuing their education in a performing arts or visual arts field at a college or university. A letter of recommendation from an ACHS faculty member outside of the Fine Arts department is required.

**Butterfly Effect of Maddox J. LoPriore Foundation Scholarship** - The Butterfly Effect of Maddox J. LoPriore Foundation will present a \$1,000 scholarship to one male and one female athlete at ACHS. The winners must intend to enroll in a 2-or 4-year college, university, or vocational school. Applicants must have participated in athletics over 4 years of high school and carry a minimum GPA of 3.0. Winners will agree to be photographed with members of the Foundation and allow the Foundation to use the photo in marketing designed to promote Foundation activities. Winners will be invited and encouraged to attend major Foundation events and fundraisers throughout the year to share their experience in the scholarship program.

Applicants must submit a 500-word essay that tells a story about their love of family, friends, and community. The essay should explain how these relationships have helped them become a caring, helpful, and successful leader amongst peers, family, and community. Applicants should describe how love and kindness has affected their life and offer examples that demonstrate these outstanding qualities. Applicants may provide additional details about their academic achievements and life ambition, along with specifics of how this scholarship would possibly affect their future.

**Deb Rummel Memorial Scholarship** – A \$1,000 scholarship will be given to a student that is planning to become a teacher, with priority given to those entering the area of Health or Physical Education, or a student that has interest in the area of Family and Consumer Science. School and community involvement is preferred (i.e. sports, music, student council, church, etc.). In addition to completing the application, please answer this essay prompt: Learning during the past few years (due to Covid) has been very difficult for schools, teachers, students, and families. We all had to change how we did things. What are five things your teachers did that have made your education better, and what is one thing you wish they would/could have changed to make learning better for students?

**District 117 Education Association – ACHS Scholarship** – \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a senior planning to become a teacher.

**District 117 Viking Football and Cheerleading Scholarship** – \$1,000 scholarship offered in each category to a District 117 student who participated in either the Viking Football or Cheerleading Program for at least two years in grammar and/or middle school. Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and plan to enroll in a 2- or 4-year college, trade or technical school. In addition to completing the local scholarship application, please answer in 250 words or less, "How did your experience with the Viking Football or Cheerleading Program help prepare you for college?" Indicate whether you were a football player or a cheerleader, and attach the typed essay to your application.

**Gail D. Dubek Memorial Scholarship** – A \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a student enrolling in a vocational school or a 2- or 4-year college. They should have interests in any of the following: art & design, dance, textiles, woodworking, writing, psychology/counseling, and culinary arts.

**Harold Redding Memorial Masonic Scholarship** – \$1,000 award will be given to a senior planning to attend an Illinois school.

**Heartland Bank and Trust Scholarship** – \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating high school senior who has actively participated in community service on his/her own or through such clubs as Interact, Blood Drive, Teen Court, Peer Mediation, FCA, Student Council or NHS. Must be planning to enroll in a 2- or 4-year post- secondary institution next fall. *Must include a letter describing his/her involvement in the club or individual community service.*

**Jim Corrigan Memorial Scholarship** – \$3,000 award to an Antioch student who plans to pursue a degree in the humanities or education. Applicants must provide evidence of college enrollment, maintain a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale, and indicate financial need.

**John J. Kakacek Memorial Athletic Scholarship** – \$500 award will be given to an athlete who will enroll in a 2-or 4-year school, has been involved in school activities and who has shown leadership.

**John M. Cunnea Business Scholarship** – \$2,000 scholarship to a student planning on studying business at a 2-or 4-year school. Applicants are judged based on their application and a transcript of grades, with varying emphasis on academics, leadership and financial need.

John P. Miller Memorial Scholarship for Nursing— This scholarship seeks to honor the life of John P. Miller (Class of '88) by supporting students who share John's desire to help others through nursing and healthcare. John Miller was a loving son, brother, uncle, and friend who lived a life full of empathy for others. The John P. Miller Memorial Nursing Scholarship is set up to remember John and his caring spirit, empathy, and compassion. The family of John P. Miller will present a \$500 scholarship to one male and one female student pursuing an accredited nursing program. Recipients must intend to enroll in a 2-or 4-year college, university, or vocational institute with the intent to enter the nursing profession. Applicants must carry a minimum GPA of 3.0. Winners will agree to be photographed and allow the use of the photo in any social media posts or activities. If you are an outstanding Senior Sequoit who is passionate about helping people and believes that nursing is the best way to channel this desire, you may apply for this scholarship.

Applicants must submit an essay which illustrates their ambitions, love of family, friends, and community. The essay should explain what inspired you to pursue the nursing profession, what you hope to achieve through your career and how you can help carry the values and traits exemplified by John. Applicants should provide additional details about their academic achievements along with specifics of how this scholarship would positively affect their future.

**Lake Villa Firefighters Association Scholarship** – \$1,000 scholarship to a student planning on studying Public Safety, Firefighting, Emergency Medical Care, Nursing, or other related fields.

**Neal V. Anderson Memorial Angler Scholarship** – This award is in memory of Neal Anderson, a former student at Antioch Community High School; Neal was an avid fisherman and outdoorsman. A \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating ACHS senior planning to attend a 2-year or 4-year college, technical or trade school. *Applicants must demonstrate a love for fishing, camping, gardening, hiking, or nature conservation by writing a letter describing how involvement outdoors has shaped the person you are today. Attach the letter to the application.* 

**Northern Illinois Conservation Scholarship** – A \$1,000 scholarship to a District 117 student interested in an environmentally based degree. Student should plan to enroll in a 4-year college. <u>Applicants will need to write a 500-word essay stating how their degree will benefit the environment</u>.

**Penny Anne Soulak Memorial Scholarship** – The Penny's Purpose Board of Directors is awarding a \$300 scholarship to a senior at ACHS and a senior at Lakes who have been involved in philanthropic activities in their community during their time at ACHS and Lakes, including volunteering for The Penny's Purpose. Applicants must be planning to attend a 2- or 4-year college or university. Applicants will need to write a short essay describing their community involvement including a description of their experience volunteering for The Penny's Purpose and why giving back to others is important to them. If you are selected as a finalist, the scholarship committee will set up an interview with you.

**Sarah Menoni Memorial Scholarship** – This award is in memory of Sarah Menoni, Spanish teacher at Antioch Community High School from 2006-2010. Two \$2,000 scholarships will be awarded to seniors planning to become teachers. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0, and additional consideration will be given to financial need.

Sequoit Pride Scholarship - A one-time scholarship of \$500 to one male and one female student planning to enroll in a post-secondary education program as a full-time, degree-seeking, first-year student. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above, demonstrated a strong sense of community pride, been involved in and made an impact in clubs, activities, and/or athletic teams, and fostered strong school spirit at ACHS. The scholarship can be applied to tuition, fees, books, or supplies required for a full-time course load at a college, university, or post-secondary education institution in the United States. A written offer/proof of admission from your selected college/university will be required if selected as the winner. In addition to the application, please answer in 500 words or less: How has your involvement in extracurricular activities impacted your high school experience, and how has it helped you prepare for college?

**State Bank of the Lakes CLC Scholarship** – \$2,500 to a graduating ACHS senior for the purpose of supporting a post-secondary education at the College of Lake County. The \$2,500 award is to be used for tuition and book expenses and will be paid in increments of \$1,250 for each year of attendance, not to exceed two years. Students must maintain a 2.0 grade point average during this two-year period. Grades and proof of enrollment will be provided to the bank, prior to issuing payment to the school.

**Suraya Brook Memorial Scholarship** – \$200 to senior who has studied Spanish in high school and who will continue to study Spanish in college.

**Tommy Howe III Heart and Soul Scholarship** – Tommy Howe was a 2016 graduate of ACHS. A \$1,000 scholarship is being awarded in his honor to an ACHS athlete who exemplifies the many qualities and characteristics that Tommy demonstrated. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher. Please read the short biography of Tommy (a copy can be found in your email, Google classroom, or you can pick up a copy in Student Services). After reading Tommy's short biography please answer the essay question, "In what ways do you feel a connection to Tommy's "Heart and Soul"? Applicants must also submit a letter of recommendation from an ACHS coach.

**William J. Hart Memorial Scholarship** - Mr. Hart was a 1958 graduate of ACHS with a lifelong career in education. A \$1500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who plans to become a teacher and has demonstrated academic excellence, as well as active participation in school and community. The applicant's statement of goals and essays will be an important consideration. Please attach an essay of 500 words or less discussing what has influenced your decision to become a teacher.
