VISION OF A LEARNER:

The North Kingstown Vision of the Learner is an exciting new initiative that is ready for school-level implementation in the 2025-2026 school year. The Vision of the Learner (VoL) applies to all students in the North Kingstown School Department. It identifies the most essential, transferable skills that students must practice and demonstrate throughout their schooling experience. These skills are not divided by content area or grade level. Rather, they are a comprehensive set of skills that transcend the traditional school experience and extend into college, career, and beyond.

The Vision of the Learner was developed by a Design Team, which consisted of stakeholders from throughout the North Kingstown community. The Design Team included district and building administrators, teachers, staff members, students, parents, and community partners. This team has met regularly for the past year and a half, and has spent considerable time reviewing relevant materials and data, with the purpose of identifying the Guiding Skills that all students need to practice and demonstrate in order to achieve success in college and career. The Guiding Skills are as follows:


- Communicate to Express
- Collaborate to Connect
- Analyze to Think Critically
- Problem Solve to Innovate
- Navigate Change to Adapt and Thrive

In addition to these Guiding Skills, the Design Team also established grade-based Learner Progressions, which identify the actionable outcomes that students aim to demonstrate as they move through the grade levels. These learner progressions, which are presented as "I Can" statements, provide clear descriptions of the student-based outcomes for each skill area.


