Total Solar Eclipse on April 8

While students are home on Monday, April 8, a total solar eclipse will cross North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada. A solar eclipse occurs when the moon casts its shadow on the Earth as it passes between the Earth and the Sun.

On this day, people within a 124-mile-wide band in the state of Ohio will experience a total solar eclipse. Areas in Ohio that are outside the path of totality will experience a partial eclipse. Attica, will observe the total solar eclipse sometime between 3:08 - 3:19 p.m.

This will be an exciting celestial event and we want our students and their families to enjoy the day safely. To safely view the sun, you'll need to wear specialized eye protection (not sunglasses or safety goggles) designed for solar viewing. For safety guidelines, visit science.nasa.gov/eclipses/safety/.

A total solar eclipse is a rare and spectacular event. On average, one happens somewhere on the Earth only once every 1.5 years.

Only 21 total solar eclipses have crossed the lower 48 states in the entire existence of the United States.

The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806. The next total solar eclipse in Ohio will be in the year 2099.

FROM THE TREASURER'S DESK




Though I've been a lifelong member of the Seneca East community, I am still in my first year as an employee of SE. As I have been researching and analyzing the revenue sources for SE, I thought it might be helpful to share an overview of how the District receives funding.

Funding schools in Ohio is complex.

At Seneca East, the majority of our funding comes from the State of Ohio through the Department of Education and Workforce's funding formula. The formula calculates the State's share of the cost of educating enrolled students. This amount is driven both by student enrollment and a variety of factors such as demographics, student needs (special education), and other programs like career-technical education, offered by the District.

The chart below represents our General Fund's revenue sources for fiscal year 2023:



Like most other School Districts, Seneca East relies on the local support of taxpayers in the form of property and income taxes to operate. In addition, specific programs receive Federal and State grants to help ensure the needs of all students are met, and we continuously look for opportunities to secure new grant funding to help provide resources to maintain a healthy fund balance. As most property owners are aware, Seneca County just completed its sexennial reappraisal that resulted in some significant increases to property values throughout the county. Property taxes are collected and divided among the various political subdivisions within a given taxing district based on millage rates (\$1 of tax per \$1,000 of assessed value) levied on the properties within each district. Ohio's property tax system is designed to help reduce the impact of inflationary increases in property taxes by requiring the County Auditor to adjust the effective tax rates annually. Below is a comparison of the effective tax rates billed for Seneca East in tax year 2022 (collection 2023) and tax year 2023 (collection 2024), for residential and agricultural properties:

While we do expect some modest increased property tax collections in the coming year, tax rates have been adjusted to help minimize the cost to property owners. State law provides that a school district's general fund levies cannot fall below 20 mills; therefore, in 2024, SE will be collecting the minimum allowed by law, in the general fund, and the overall tax rate has reduced by nearly 5 mills.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION NOW OPEN

It's time to round up our newest Tigers! Kindergarten registration packets are now available at the school office and on our website at se-tigers.com.

Children must be 5 years old on or before Aug. 1, 2024, to be eligible for kindergarten. Parents/guardians must turn in completed registration forms and provide the district with the following by April 10:

- Government-issued birth certificate
- Up-to-date immunization records
- Proof of residency
- Copy of custody paperwork, if applicable

A meeting will be held in the school auditorium on April 11 at 5 p.m. for parents who may still need to submit paperwork or have questions. Screenings will take place on May 16-17 in our kindergarten classrooms and will last between 45 minutes and one hour. While students are being screened by teachers, parents will review important information.

PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION UNDERWAY

Preschool registration for the 2024-2025 school year is underway, and spots are filling up fast! Registration runs from Feb. 26–March 31, so don't delay!

All applicants being considered for enrollment will be screened using the following criteria:

- Prospective students must be 4 years old by Aug. 1, 2024.
- Applications will be dated in the order in which they are received. Placement into Tiny Tigers Preschool will be prioritized by this date.
- Children 4 years old and residing in the Seneca East Local School District will be given first priority for preschool enrollment unless the prospective student has an older sibling already attending Seneca East Local Schools.
 Then, their application will be entered in the order it was received.

Prospective students from outside Seneca East Local School District are encouraged to apply and will be admitted (if space allows) in the order they are received. Once all spots are taken, applicants will be placed on a waiting list and contacted if/when an opening arises.



2024-2025 Open Enrollment

Seneca East's open enrollment application for the 2024-2025 school year is now available on the school website. Please submit completed forms by April 3, 2024.

CHILD FIND

In accordance with federal law, Seneca East Local Schools assumes responsibility for the location, identification and evaluation of all children (from birth to age 21) who may require special education and/or related services. This identification process, also called "Child Find," is coordinated by the Special Education Department of Seneca East Local Schools.

If you know or suspect that a child may have a disability, you may contact the Seneca East Local Schools Special Education Department at 419-426-3344 or contact the building principal to discuss these concerns and determine a course of action.

CALL FOR INPUT ON TITLE VI-B FUNDS

Title VI-B funds are federal allocations for the exclusive benefit of children with disabilities. Input as to how best to utilize these funds for Seneca East Local Schools is welcome. APRIL AND MAY TESTING SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL

Below are upcoming scheduling changes for our middle school and high school students. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the school office or Mrs. Hunker.

- April 17 and 18 ELA Testing -No change in daily schedule
- April 30 and May 1 Math Testing
 - Grades 6-7-8 will take Algebra I and Geometry tests
 - On this day, students not in Algebra I or Geometry testing may have a 2-hour delay, or they can come to school on time and go to an assigned classroom until classes begin later in the day

- May 7 Science and Social Studies Testing
 - Grades 6 and 7 No change in daily schedule
 - Grade 8 will be testing
- Students taking Biology, American History and Government will also be testing
- On this day high school students not in testing will be allowed a delayed schedule. Students may arrive either at 11:22 a.m. for a lunch/study hall or 12:32 p.m., when class begins. Please note that high school students must be at school by 12:32 p.m. for afternoon classes.
