- Regular and punctual attendance is considered an indicator of College and Career Readiness and is a strong contributing factor to a student's success in school.
- Frequent absences may lead to poor academic work, lack of social development, and possible academic failure. No single factor may interfere with a student's progress more quickly than frequent absences or tardiness.
- To report an absence, please call the office before 7:50 am to inform us your child will be absent.
- A student is considered tardy if he/she is not in his/her homeroom seat when the bell rings.
 Students who are late to class or school three or more times in a marking cycle will be subject to disciplinary consequences.
- Notification letters will be sent home when students accrue excessive absences from school.

Prohibited Behaviors

All members of the school community must report concerning behaviors when there is an intent or plan threatening violence, aggression, or harm which includes any of the following prohibited and concerning behaviors:

- ★ Engaging in violence
- ★ Threatening violence or aggression (intent or plan)
- * Weapon to school or attempt to bring
- Bullying or harassing behavior
- Fearful victim or third party; disruption to activity
- * Continued intent to carry out threat
- * History of threats, aggression or violence
- Immediate danger or imminent safety concern
- Sexual harassment, assault, domestic violence, dating violence
- Staff, parent or student perceives threatening circumstances
- Administrator unable to determine if a situation poses risk to school personnel or communitu
- Any other Indicators suggesting the possibility of a targeted attack against an individual or the school

How Do I Report the Situation?

IN PERSON

ReportIt App

Use the QR Code on the posters around the school or on the school webpage tab on each homepage. This will bring you to the app to report the situation on your phone/device.

HIB Form
