 - Are in Mrs. Jacobi's Hon Eng 12 class and would like a second MC course opportunity

Spring Dual Enrollment with Middlesex College is open from 1/22 – 2/12.

New dual enrollment students:

Complete the Middlesex College dual enrollment application and registration form <u>HERE</u>. Submissions must be received by **3pm on 2/12.**

- Create your account be sure to write down your username and password.
- Once your account is created, select 'Dual Enrollment Application' and proceed with completing the application and submitting your course requests.

Returning dual enrollment students:

Complete registration Jotform <u>HERE</u>. Make sure you have your Middlesex College student ID number and Middlesex College email address as they are required fields. Jotforms must be received by **3pm on 2/12**.

*Returning students ONLY: If you don't know your MC ID#, request it by emailing MCCDE@middlesexcc.edu from your high school or MC email account. Include your full name, home address, and birthdate. IDs will not be given over the phone or to a parent/guardian.

Cost: **\$135** per course

- Select the course(s) from the list for which you are currently enrolled. If you are unsure check with your teacher or counselor.
- Submitting a form is a commitment to paying for your courses. Applications cannot be withdrawn and tuition is non-refundable.
- Students with outstanding balances will not be registered for new courses. Submit payment in self-service before registering.
- Submit your application early in case follow-up information is needed. Applications must be considered **complete by 2/12**.
- Billing statements will be available for pick-up at your high school once registration is verified. This process will take several weeks.
