The School

Metuchen High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 716 students in grades 9 through 12. Our faculty includes administration and supervisory personnel, three school counselors, one nurse, one student assistance counselor, and a child study team. Many of our staff members have earned a Master's Degree and some have earned a Doctorate Degree.

The Community

Located in the heart of central New Jersey and 25 miles south of New York City, Metuchen is a primarily residential community and a "quintessential" small town. It is known as "The Brainy Borough" because of many professionals, artists, educators and literary figures who are residents. Metuchen retains a historic character. Metuchen's 2023/24 population estimate is 15,049. The latest population demographics include 64.1% white, 16.8% Asian, 7.7 % Hispanic or Latino, 5.1% African American, 11.6% multiracial. The Curriculum

Metuchen High School offers an individualized curriculum of more than 130+ courses, including several Virtual High School course offerings. Students must satisfy the state and local requirements for graduation in grades 9 through 12, and successfully complete a minimum of 120 credits. The academic program is a traditional schedule with seven 45-minute class periods that meet once per day. 17.5 credits per semester and 35 credits per year is the standard course load.

Grade Point Average Calculation

The GPA is calculated on a weighted 4.0 scale and includes final grades in all courses taken. The GPA is computed at the end of the 6th and 8th semesters. Pass/Fail, dual credit, and independent study course work is noted on the transcript but is not factored into the GPA. All honors courses carry a + 0.5 differential, and all AP courses carry a + 1.0 differential.

Final Grades

Final grades for all courses are determined according to the following formula:

- Marking Period Grades = 84%
- Final Examination Grade = 16%

Class Rank

All students are ranked at the end of the junior year (6 semesters) and at the end of the senior year (8 semesters). Individual class rank is not reported on the high school transcript and is only shared if specifically requested in writing, by student and parent.

School Highlights

- The percentage of students in the Class of 2025 attending a two-year or four-year college is 97%.
- The majority of MHS students participate in co-curricular activities (school organizations, clubs, and sports teams). The total duplicated count for all co-curricular activities in the 2024-2025 school year was 2,538. The total duplicated count for all clubs/school organizations was 1,846. The unduplicated count for the 2025 Fall athletic season was 245 (34% of the school population), the 2024-2025 Winter athletic season was 199 (28%), and the Spring 2025 athletic season was 248 (35%). The duplicated count for all three seasons was 692. These numbers do not include managers. The student population in 2025-2025 was 716.
- The duplicated count for school organizations and clubs during the 2024-2025 school year was 1846. Keep in mind that it
 is common for students to be involved in more than one activity. Clearly, interscholastic sports, school organizations, and
 school clubs play a major role in the lives of a majority of the students who attend Metuchen High School. Athletic
 numbers were taken from the seasonal NJSIAA "Sports Participation" reports. Each advisor provided school organization
 and club numbers.
