



What is the North Dakota Envirothon?

The North Dakota Envirothon is a problem-solving natural resource competition for high school students. Teams are generally associated with a sponsoring school, and usually train the en-

tire school year with their advi-





sor or "coach" in preparation for the annual state-wide competition. Study resources in the fields of soils, aquatics, wildlife, prairie (forestry and rangeland) and a current environmental issue are assembled by natural resource professionals and provided to the teams. Using these resources, students learn the skills of thinking and working as a team to assess natural resource issues affecting the environment. In late spring, each team has the option to select five members and one alternate to compete at the North Dakota State Envirothon Competition

This is a weekend where everyone who attends is not judged for their academic or athletic talents but accepted as individuals.
