Individual classrooms have set goals for their rooms and as an entire school our overall goal is 6,302,000. Wow! Classes will be taking


virtual road trips each week along with sleuthing out the answers for US trivia.



The North Dakota Association of Secondary School Principals is excited to announce that the 2024 North Dakota Academic All-State Teams have been selected. One hundred and ninety high school seniors were nominated by their school principal and competed for statewide honor in the Class AA, A, and B divisions. Student selection is based on grade-point averages, ACT or SAT scores, extracurricular activities, community involvement, and leadership qualities. The North Dakota Association of Secondary School Principals will award Gold, Silver, and Bronze Team members an honor medallion. The medallions will be presented to the students at a ceremony at their school. In addition, WDAY and Forum Communications will also air a digital presentation honoring all the medalists. The Class B presentation will air on Friday, March 1, between the two semifinal games in the afternoon. The Class A presentation will air on Friday, March 1, between the two semifinal games in the evening. The Class AA presentation will air on Friday, March 8, between the boy's semifinals. Certificates of Merit will be sent to Honorable Mention Team members from the North Dakota Association of Secondary School Principals. "Snippets" of Science


(from the High School)



One of the first semester's electives was a Forensic Science course. These students ended their semester with a blood spatter analysis lab interpreting different types of blood drops (shown below) and solved a mock crime scene for their final project. All groups had to collect evidence from their final crime scenes, then perform various analysis tests that we had learned throughout the semester to find the right suspect!



Chemistry is the other elective science course for the 11-12 grades. They are pictured here doing the favorite flame test lab (from first semester). In this lab, they burn unknown substances and observe which colors of light are given off. If you look close at the photos, you can see the colors! From that, they can tell how much energy is released when an electron is jumping from its excited state back to its ground state. They are now working on a new unit - ionic and covalent compounds!




The second semester's 11-12th grade elective has been the "Science of Health". These students started the semester by learning how to take measurements of physical health. They wrapped that up by learning all the steps involved in running their own study – from gathering consent and scheduling time for their volunteers to test, to measuring blood pressures, heart rates, and other data! Then, they put together posters to professionally present their findings (below). It was so fun to watch them do such meaningful science! More recently, we've had a lot of good discussions on things like depression, fad diets and many other topics – trying to learn how to look at evidence behind the claims they see and make sure their sources are reliable!





The 7th grade students have been working on a photosynthesis and cellular respiration unit. A few weeks ago, they were testing how temperature, types of light and different solutions can affect how fast the spinach leaves perform photosynthesis. By timing when their spinach leaf discs float, they can see how fast they are giving off oxygen! Up next, diffusion and osmosis – and designing their own labs!






The 8th grade Earth Science group just finished up a unit about space! They are pictured here starting off the unit by doing a timeline activity on past space discoveries, then again with their final "free-choice" projects. We had several amazing models, posters and even a fun board game that were created to wrap up the unit!



I haven't caught many photos of the biology students "in action", but they have created some amazing work this year! They started the year with their "leaf projects". Each student collected and identified several species of leaves, grasses and forbs and they all spent a lot of time outside learning from Mr. Black! They also did deeper research on several unique plant adaptations and created these awesome projects. More recently, they conducted their own bacterial growth labs, learned about properties of water and macromolecules, and are now on a unit all about cell processes!





The 9th grade physical science students have been wrapping up a couple units on motion, force and energy. They awesome marble roller coasters throughout the unit and put everything together by calculating velocity, force, momentum, kinetic and potential energy, work and power of their marbles as they raced them through the tracks! Last week, they designed their own insulated cups and investigated thermal energy transfers. A lot of thought went into both these structure designs -I think there are a lot of future engineers in this




