SBG SPOTLIGHT

<u>This month's theme:</u> Explain why we don't score formatives and how to use navigate in Teacherease.

Why we don't score formative assessments.

- At IBMS, we do not score formative assessments (homework) in class or at home.
- The reason is that we believe formative assessments aim to give feedback on the assignment and allow the students to grow.
- We want formative assessments to be assignments where students are comfortable with making mistakes and strive to understand the material for mastery.
- Scoring formative assessments often puts a timeline on learning that punishes a student for late/incorrect work and can cause anxiety about academic failure while they're still learning the material.
- For these reasons, we only score summative assessments (tests)
- This way, we score more of a summary of what a student has learned through hard work rather than the accumulation of scores from timesensitive completed material.
- We understand that learning to complete tasks in a time-sensitive setting is a life skill; as a result, we have created the learning incentive program (L.I.P.) at IBMS, which aims to reward students for success in this area without punishing them academically.
