#### A Message from Principal Emilsson

Greetings and Salutations BVMS Community!

On behalf of the staff at BVMS, let me say "WELCOME BACK!!" We are excited to start another school year especially after the great progress that we made last year. Buena Vista Middle School had a very successful year!

Academically, the school reduced the number of "F's" from 382 in 2021-22 to 259 last year in 2022-23. That is a reduction of 32%! In addition, the number of students who received at least one failing grade dropped from 82 students to 60...a reduction of 27%!

Attendance improved as well. Chronically absent students (those with 17 or more absences) dropped from 54 to 39 students, and students with less than 10 absences rose from 46% to 54%. We had more kids in their seats last year experiencing more success academically...and it shows.

The students showed their skills by beating the State average in 6/7 tests on the Colorado Measure of Academic Success tests (CMAS). We still have a long way to go, but we are very proud to see our students achieving at high levels. We are still waiting to see more data from the State, but the initial results that were reported are very encouraging. Those numbers reflect achievement, and while achievement is valued, it is the growth scores that we are really excited about. We anticipate those growth scores to be high as well. We hope to have the student's individual results available by the time Parent-Student Presentations happen in mid-October.

BVMS is committed to helping all students experience success and feel pride in their accomplishments. We believe that students feel valued when they are challenged academically and held accountable for their learning. We believe that all students can grow academically by putting forth an effort. The staff at BVMS are the most dedicated and caring group of professionals that I have had the pleasure of working with in my 25 years in education. They are here to help the students reach their goals. Students...you are in good hands. Put forth the effort and you will reap the rewards. Let's have a great school year everyone!

# **INFINITE CAMPUS**

If you haven't familiarized yourself with Infinite Campus yet, you might be missing a lot! This is the web-based program that staff and teachers use to track nearly everything in the school.

You can access daily announcements, student grades, attendance, lunch account balances (including adding funds), and more. Nearly everything you need to know is right at your fingertips!



Not only can you get this information from the Infinite Campus website (link at the bottom of the page), there's also a convenient app you can get on your phone. You do not need to remember to get on a website to check grades—they will come to you!

#### **CAMPUS PARENT APP**

- Find it on the App Store or Google Play by searching for Campus Parent.
- Use the same log-in you use for the web program. If you do not have log-in information yet, please email the school to request more information.
- Once logged in, you will receive real-time notifications when grades and attendance are posted on the system.
- If your student has a mobile phone, have them get the **Campus Student** app with notifications. That way, they will know what you know!



To download Campus Parent mobile app, visit the App Store or Google Play and search Campus Parent or click on the direct link below. USER TIP: You will need to click on the screen notifications for more details. For example, if a student is not INCLASS for any reason (field trip, nurse's office, special event, meeting, etc.), you might get a notification they are absent. This does not necessarily mean they are not at school. If you have notified the school of an absence, please wait until the end of the school day to allow for staff to get excused absences entered.

### SCHOOL POLICY HIGHLIGHTS & REMINDERS

#### **ATTENDANCE**

We had 39 students who were considered "Habitually or Chronically Truant." That's 16% of the student population of the middle school. We want that number to be even less. Habitually truant students miss 17 or more days of school in a year...which is 10% of the school year. Those can be excused or unexcused absences. When your student gets to 17 days it doesn't matter anymore. An absence is an absence. The school will continue to notify and communicate with families frequently this year to make sure everyone is aware with how many days their student has missed. There is a proven correlation between attendance and academic success. We made good gains last year, vet we can do better.

#### **GRADES**

We will continue our focus on grades and eliminating "F's." This year all classes will set up their grading to reflect the following: 80% Mastery and 20% Work Habits. Work Habits are defined in our school's Work Habit Rubric which is a combination of Effort, Participation, Responsibility, and Work Completion.

This year, each teacher will assign points weekly for students' Work Habits. Those points will be weighted as 20% of a student's overall grade. Excused absences will not count against the student. Not all excused absences are excused absences! For example, Family vacation, hunting, and illness with no documentation are not excused. Medical documented absences (Excused Medical), Court, Office Conferences, School Activities, Homebound, Bereavement (up to 3 days), and other are ex-

cused. Additionally, just because a student is in their seat might not mean they earn a point that day.

Afterall, Work Habits aren't just about showing up...one needs to demonstrate the other indicators as well...like engagement! Showing up and working hard matters, and we hope bringing consistency with work habits grading will help to convey this message to our students.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Once again this year, we will be running weekly eligibility checks for all students. Students will need to make sure they don't have any F's in their classes to stay eligible to participate or attend extra-curricular activities sports but also school dances, field trips, movie nights, and other "fun" activities designed to promote our school culture. Parents and Guardians will receive a notice when their student finds themselves on the ineligible list. We have many resources to help students stay off the list including Homework Help Tuesday-Thursday from 5:00. Let's work together to eliminate F's and have all students experience success this school year.

#### SCHEDULE

Our schedule has changed this year. We are eliminating the Tuesday and Wednesday block days, and going with just the 8-period day every day with a short Advisory after lunch. Ninetyminute classes have some advantages, but they also have a number of disadvantages. Having everyday contact with students for 45 minutes each day

will eliminate a lot of "down time" for students and will serve to maximize instructional time.

#### YOUR VOICE/COMMUNICATION

This year, the middle school is making a conscious effort to give students and their families more of a voice in the school. "Lunch with Fearless Leader" will be a new addition to the school culture this year. Each month, students can sign up to have a pizza lunch with the principal. The lunch is intended for students to share with the principal their views on how things are working in the school, things they would like to see change, and anything else they feel we should know. You don't have to be in student council to make sure your voice is heard!

Additionally, the school will be including a monthly parent survey on a variety of school related issues. We value your feedback and want to make sure that your voice is heard pertaining to a number of things that affect our school. Be sure to look for it in the newsletter

#### LUNCHES

The voters of Colorado have approved a measure to provide lunches for the students who do not qualify for Federal free lunches. Families who may qualify for the federal program are still encouraged to apply as it helps provide the school district with federal funding for lunches, and may help to reduce your costs in student and athletic fees.

#### SUMMER SCHOOL

Any student who fails two or more quarters of a core academic class (Language Arts, Science, Math, and/or Social Studies) will be required to attend summer school to ensure that key concepts were learned before advancing to the next grade level.

There is an additional day available for homework help this year. We are serious about being available to help your child succeed!

- School activities and opportunities...we have lots of things happening throughout the school year, from field trips to after school activities/clubs and special events. - Speaking of after school...students are released at 3:25 each day, and will either head out the south doors (through the athletic commons) to catch their bus home or exit the front of the school for pick up. Students who walk home may leave through either of those doors. Please note: Unless a student is staying after school because they are participating in a club/activity, heading to sports practice, or attending either homework help or academic

support, they must leave the building by 3:40. Students may pre-arrange with individual teachers for specialized after school help. Students may not be in the school building after school hours without direct teacher/staff supervision.

#### What is the Parent Leadership Team?

The Parent Leadership Team (PLT) for Buena Vista Middle School serves a similar purpose as a traditional PTO. However, the structure is not as formal as a PTO. The PLT is not a separate non-profit organization, and there are no board members or elections. Funds which are raised through this group are deposited directly to the school district, and the school administration approves any purchases.

During the school year, the PLT looks for volunteer opportunities to assist and thank school staff. The goal of monthly meetings is to promote conversations between parents and school staff, identify needs of the school, and plan fundraisers to enhance school and teacher activities. Additionally, they host meals and treats for teacher/staff appreciation throughout the year.
