Welcome Back from Spring Break! It's April and that means it's testing season. Last year the students performed at the highest level on the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) that the school has ever seen since at least 2013 when I first became principal of the school. We scored 79.1/100 points on the CMAS test...the 2nd highest score in all of our Mountain BOCES region, and the highest among all of the secondary schools in the region. That was due to a lot of hard work by the students and the staff. It's something that we hope to see continue!

To help motivate our students to try their best last year, we offered all students who showed double performance or double high growth on the ELA and Math tests a voucher to go to Elitch Gardens Amusement Park in Denver. I am glad to say that we will be giving out those vouchers at our school assembly: the RISE Olympics on April 11th. Eighty-five students earned the vouchers last year, and we are offering them the same incentive this year to try and get students to try their hardest on the test. While high achievement scores are always great to see, it's our growth scores that we value most. We don't get to decide where a student is academically when they come to our school, but we can (and do) help them to grow. We hope the Elitch vouchers will help motivate the students to try their best on the test once again this year.

In addition to CMAS, all students will be taking the spring NWEA Achievement tests at the end of the month. These are the same tests that the students took back in September. They help the school see student growth over the course of the year, and give us another measure that we can compare to CMAS and our local BV Essentials. These tests help us to ensure that we are correct about what we think our students can do.

Once we get through all the testing , it's time to have some fun and celebrate the end of the year. May has many fun things in store for the kids....one of which is our time honored tradition of 6th grade Conservation Camp. Parents of 6th graders, make sure you put the 6th grade Conservation Camp Parent Meeting on your calendar. We will meet at 6pm in the Performance Flex Theatre on April 16th. Information about Conservation Camp, and the end of the year camping trip will be shared that night. I hope to see you all there. Parents of 7th and 8th graders, look in next month's newsletter for information about information for your student's end of the year activities. The 3rd Quarter Honor Roll trip to the Sand Dunes will be on Wednesday, May 15th. The kids eligible for that trip will be bringing home permission slips for the trip. Be on the lookout for those. Keep grinding BVMS, we are on the home stretch...finish strong!
