A Focused Month of Learning

April is our last full month of instruction before our 3rd–5th grade students begin Smarter Balanced Testing in May. This makes April an especially important time for continued learning, practice, and confidence-building.

Our staff is working hard to ensure students feel prepared and supported. You can help at home by encouraging consistent attendance, strong effort, and a positive mindset toward learning.

Supporting the Whole Child: MTSS at Barnes

At Barnes, we are committed to supporting students through a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)—both academically and socially/emotionally.

As we began Trimester 3 on March 16th, we completed our final Social & Emotional Benchmarking for the year. Our Tier 2 Social Emotional Team met with teachers to review student needs and identify supports focused on key skill areas such as:

- Self-management; Building positive relationships; Social awareness; Responsible decision-making; Self-awareness

Through this process, we identify “lagging skills” and work together—teachers and our TSEC team—to provide targeted instruction and support. Just as we work to teach students how to become stronger readers, writers, and mathematicians, we also believe social and emotional skills can be taught, practiced, and strengthened. We are proud of the intentional work happening to support every student's growth.

YOU KNOW THE DRILL...

Barnes Safety Update: ***APRIL EVACUATION DRILL***

During April, Barnes Elementary will conduct a school-wide evacuation drill to ensure students and staff are prepared in case of an emergency.

What Students Will Do:

- 1 - Follow adult directions and exit using assigned routes
- 2 - Move calmly, quietly, and safely
- 3 - Stay with their class while attendance is taken
- 4 - Return to class when directed

Why Practice Matters:

Practicing safety routines helps students stay calm, make safe decisions, and respond confidently during emergencies.

Practice at Home:

- 1 - Identify two exits from each room
- 2 - Choose a family meeting place
- 3 - Practice safe and quick exits
- 4 - Create plans for other locations your child visits

Talk With Your Child:

Remind students that drills are practice to keep everyone safe and that listening to adults is important.

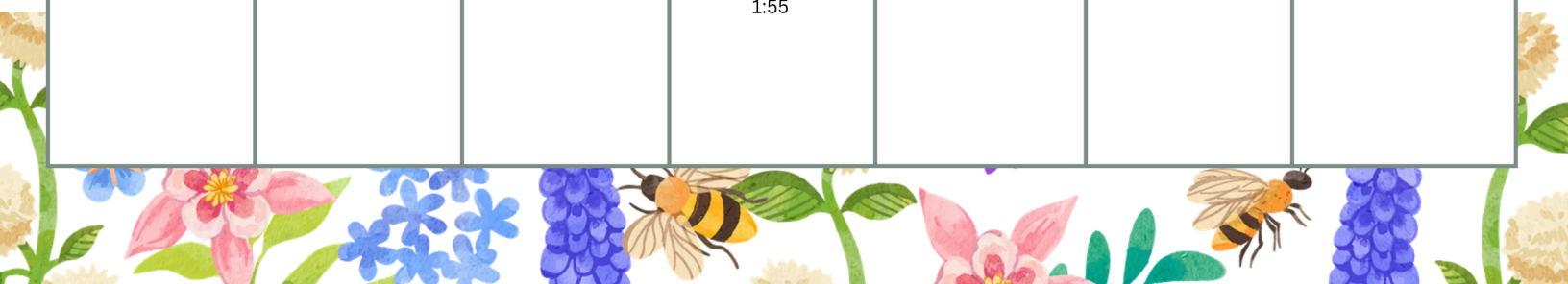

PLAN FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER

Snow, ice, and wind can impact our ability to conduct school activities as planned. Depending on the road conditions, any one of the following may happen:

- 1) Buses are on snow routes.**
All schools and activities continue, but some routes are altered. Snow route details are on our Transportation web page.
- 2) School is delayed two hours.**
Buses pick up students two hours later than normal; no breakfast or AM preschool.
- 3) School is canceled for the day.**
All schools, activities, and athletics are canceled for the day.
- 4) School is dismissed early.**
All activities and athletics are canceled.

HOW WE DECIDE

Before deciding to close schools, district officials consult county road crews and our own employees who are out driving the roads in the early hours of the morning.

Our district covers a large region with steep terrain in places. While roads may be passable in town, conditions may be different just a few miles away. Before we close schools we seek answers to the questions below:

- Can we ensure that buses can navigate streets safely?
- Will students be safe waiting for buses, driving, or walking to school?
- What are the predicted weather conditions later in the school day so we can also ensure students a safe return home?
- Will conditions be substantially improved if we start school late?
- Will we have heat and lights in our schools?

HOW WE INFORM YOU

We attempt to provide you with as much prior notice of school closures as possible. We make every effort to announce changes by 6 AM and we use a variety of methods to get the information to parents and staff.
