Message from the Principal

Dear Cougar Families,

As we welcome the arrival of April, I am filled with a sense of gratitude for our wonderful community and the opportunities we have to support one another in our educational journey. Spring is a time of growth, both in nature and within our school community, and I am excited to share some highlights and important updates with you all. At Green Valley Elementary, we are fortunate to have a dedicated team of educators, supportive families, and enthusiastic students who make our school a vibrant and inclusive learning environment. This month, we've had the pleasure of celebrating numerous achievements and milestones among our students, thanks to the unwavering support of our community.

With the arrival of spring, our campus has come alive with the sights and sounds of the season. From colorful flowers blooming in our garden to the laughter of children playing during recess, there is a palpable sense of joy and renewal in the air. I encourage all members of our community to take advantage of the warmer weather and embrace outdoor activities that promote health and well-being.

I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all the parents, guardians, and volunteers who continue to play an integral role in our school community. Whether it's through volunteering in classrooms, participating in school events, or offering words of encouragement, your support is truly invaluable. A huge thanks to our PTO for their unwavering dedication in supporting staff and students at Carrolls through their fundraising efforts that support activities for each one of your children. We raised close to \$6,000 in BINGO this year and nearly \$750 in the coin drive for the library. It is not too late to join the PTO as we have a few more meetings scheduled through the end of the school year.

Drills –

Reminder that we practice safety drills each month to help ensure the preparedness of staff and students in the case of a real emergency. These drills include: earthquake, fire, lock down, shelter in place, secure & teach, and evacuation. You can help your child reflect upon the drill by asking the following questions at home after you have received the memo from the office that we had a drill:

- Why does Dr. Owens have you practice drills every month at Carrolls?
- Can you tell me about the emergency drill you had at school today? What did you learn and what were the steps you were supposed to take?
- How did you feel during the drill? Why? What would help you feel more prepared, if anything?
- What are some things we can do at home to make sure we're prepared for emergencies, just like you practice at school?

4th **& 5**th **Grade Health Curriculum:** Carrolls, Rose Valley, Barnes, and Wallace held their 4/5 health curriculum viewing night on October 24th. State Law through the AIDS Omnibus Act (RCW 28A.230.070) requires any parents who wish to excuse their child from HIV/STD instruction must personally preview the materials and complete an opt-out form each school year. The 4/5 classes will go over this material on Friday May 24, 2024. Please contact Dr. Owens if you would like to come into the office to review the material to make an informed decision on whether you would like to opt your child out.

As we enter the final stretch of the school year, I want to remind our students, parents, and staff about the importance of preparing for the upcoming Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) exams for grades 3-5 and iReady assessments for grades K-5. These assessments provide valuable insights into student learning and growth, and help us identify areas where additional support may be needed.

I am confident that with the dedication of our teachers, the support of our families, and the hard work of our students, we will continue to see success in these assessments. Together, we will ensure that every student has the opportunity to reach his or her full potential and achieve academic excellence.

Spring Assessments grades K-5: Every Cougar will take part in the end of year spring assessments for math & ELA with iReady. Testing will begin the week of May 6th and the window closes and **all students need to be assessed** no later than June 7th. While we cannot control unforeseen circumstances, please be mindful of these dates when scheduling a weekend away, doctor's appointments, or other activities.

Grades 3-5 May 6^{th} -10th Grades K-2 May 20th -31st

Spring SBA Assessments grades 3-5: The Smarter Balanced Assessment for grades 3-5 is fast approaching. We will be engaging in Smarter Balanced (Language Arts & Math) May 20th – May 31st. It is imperative that your student arrive to school, on time, in order to have the entire time allotted to them to test. Testing will occur on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays (05/20, 05/21, 05/23, 05/29, 05/30) and we will use Wednesday & Fridays for make-up/finish days. While we cannot control unforeseen circumstances, please be mindful of this when scheduling a weekend away, doctor's appointments, or other activities. The 5th grade students will have an additional state assessment for science on May 24th.


