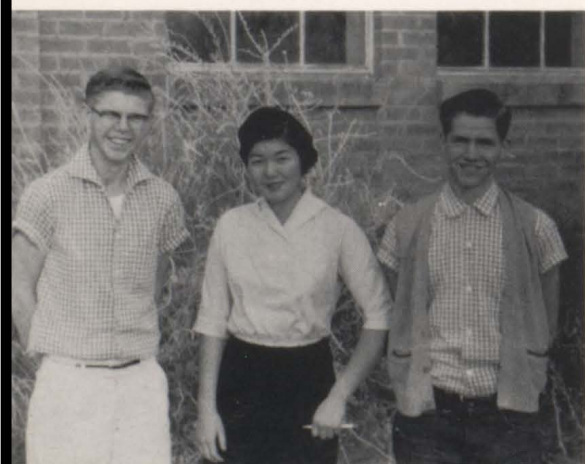
Student Council

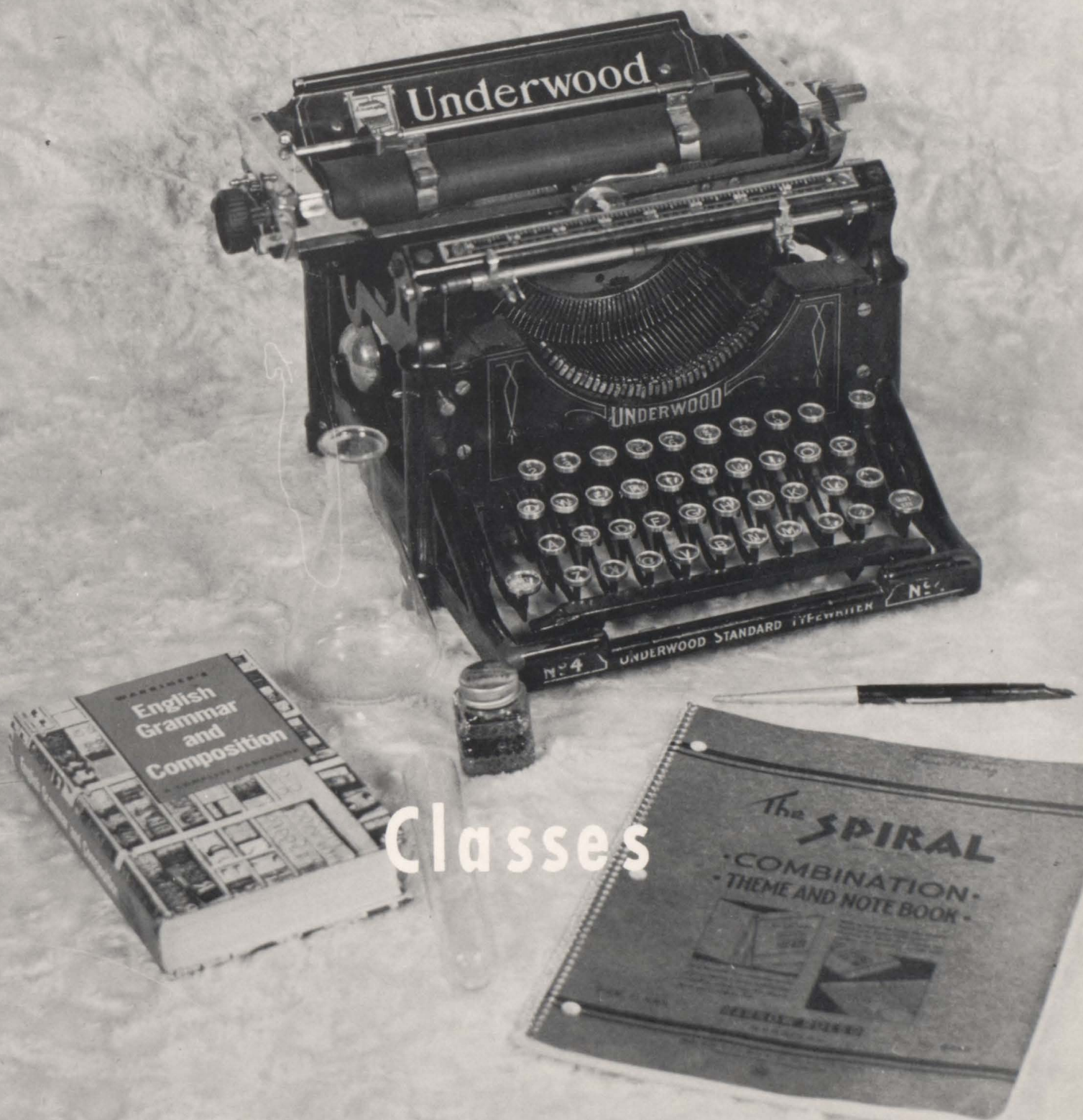
Another first for the Student Council was the sponsoring of exchange assemblies with Ontario, which was carried out the latter part of the year.

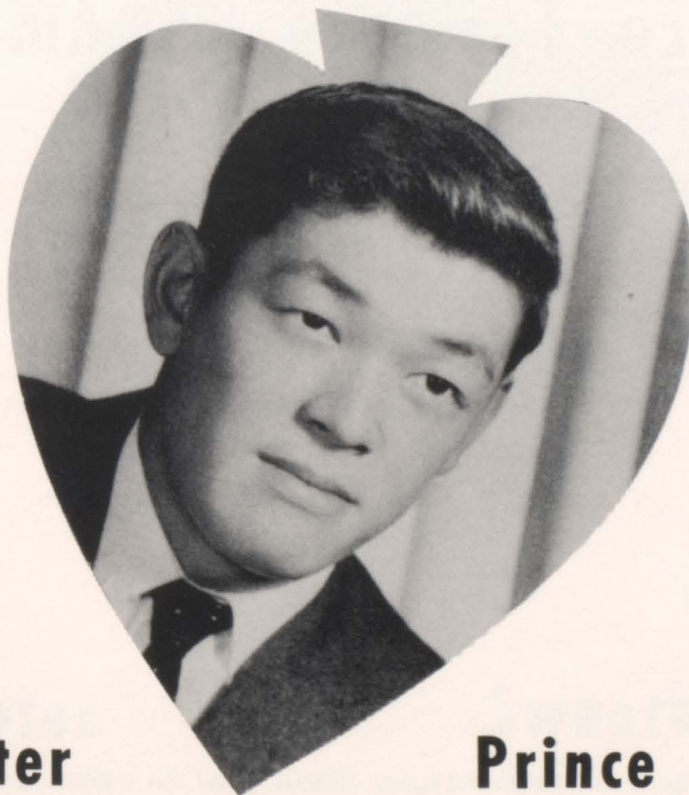

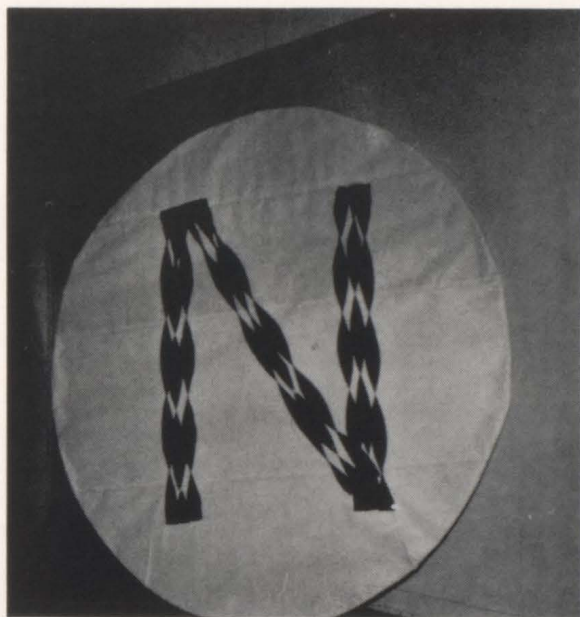
