We are already a month into another fabulous school year! The staff and student body have been hard at work, and the school district looks like a busy bee hive. Fall activities are well underway and our students are finding success in and out of the classroom.

Each September, the Board of Education adopts the annual budget and sets the tax request to support the district through the fiscal year. Part of the fiscal responsibility that the Board has is to look beyond the current fiscal year and plan for the future of the district. Our Board of Education adopted the budget during the September 18th meeting. This year patrons will see a drop in the tax request in the general fund. This drop accounts for an increase in funding from the State level in the form of foundation aid and increased reimbursement for special education costs. The district will be taxing in the Qualified Capital Purpose Undertaking Fund (QCPUF) in preparation for future needs for renovations and safety needs of the district.

Again please check out "Events" on our school website for changes in time, date, or location of school activities. Throughout the year it is necessary to make adjustments after the calendars are printed and sometimes I make a mistake on time.

Also, I sent out a one-call earlier this month regarding changes in a student's after school plans. Superintendent Patterson reviewed the bid for a new route bus provided by Truck Center Companies. The bid for a new bus totaled \$131,350. Superintendent Patterson had requested bids from two companies, but only one company submitted a bid. Truck Center Companies have a price increase set to take place at the end of the month, which would increase the current bid by

\$3,600, Superintendent Patterson encouraged the Board to approve the purchase prior to the price increase. School bus production is still a slow process. Delivery of the new bus will be 12-18 months from the date of purchase.


SCHOOL STUFF

Jr. High Guidance

The junior high are starting to learn about careers and their future through our Find Your Grind Curriculum. In class, we have discussed if they are future ready and how they want their futures to look. This curriculum helps students discover careers that fit the lifestyle they would like to have some day.

EducationQuest Shoutout

Education Quest is a great, free resource. They help families complete the paperwork for the FAFSA for free. You just have to set up an appointment. To make an appointment, call Education Quest at 308-234-6310. You can also visit their website: Educationquest.org. They have tons of great resources that I often use when I meet with the high school kids.

Junior and Senior Opportunities

As the school year is underway, it is important to know about some of the opportunities that are provided to our junior and senior classes. College Visits: Seniors are allowed to use two school days to visit a college and Juniors are allowed to use one day. These days are marked as school activity days and do not count as an absence. Visiting a college is an excellent way to help decide what institution is a good fit for your student. College have group tours and individual tours. They also have some events that focus on different careers or programs. If your student would like to visit a college, I am happy to help them make that arrangement.

Job Shadows: Juniors and seniors are allowed to take one day or two 1/2 days to job shadow. Students do have to fill out a booklet that requires them to research that career and have questions to ask on the shadow. Again, these days are counted as a school activity.
