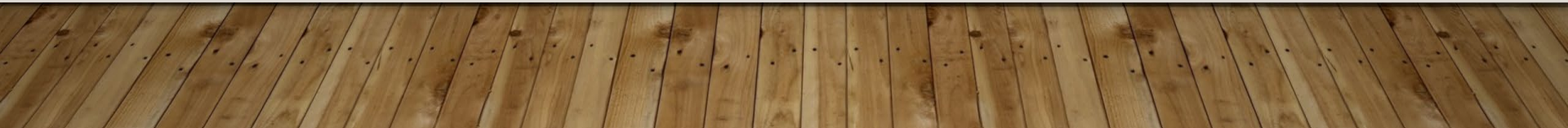
GRADE 12 SCHEDULE - HIGH SCHOOL

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT COURSES

- Courses taught at Falls High School by high school instructors to earn dual credit. Students earn both high school and college credit for these classes.
- Must successfully receive a satisfactory recommendation from department instructors to be eligible. Student remain in the high school and they stay connected to school activities.
- Attend classes with students of the same age.
- All courses taught by licensed Minnesota teachers in their subject areas.
- Chromebooks are assigned to each student.
- We encourage students interested in the PSEO option to contact the college to discuss options for your post-secondary experience. Mrs. Rolando, Mr. Grewatz or Mr. Everson will help you understanding CIS or College In the High School course.

- Parents can access student grades, attendance, and discipline online in Skyward
- Parents can communicate with instructor directly through email or phone
- Concurrent Enrollment courses and high school courses are scheduled with ease because all courses run on the high school schedule
- Opportunity to earn credit from colleges and Universities
- Student that struggles in a CIS course are able to change back to high school sections to continue earning credit.
- Like a college class, Concurrent Enrollment meet 3, 4, or 5 days a week depending on the number of course's college credits. Students are able to leave the building or gather in FHS student lounge when not in class.

HONORS INFORMATION

- MN Honor Society Requirements (Inducted fall of junior year)
 1. Minimum 3.8 cumulative GPA
 2. Open to qualifying juniors and seniors
 3. Must maintain 3.65 cumulative GPA after elected
- Academic Excellence Award Requirements
 1. Grades 9-10 Minimum 3.7 cumulative GPA
 2. Grade 11 Minimum 3.7 cumulative GPA
 3. Grade 12 Minimum 3.7 cumulative GPA
- Graduating with honors requires a minimum 3.85 cumulative GPA.
- ACT score are important scholarships but colleges are using a “GSA” or Group Scores Assessments
 - MCA’s, GPA’s, Faculty Recommendations, and GSA.

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

- Athletes need to be certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center to compete at an NCAA Division I or II school. (NCAA Handout)
- Athletes will need to create a Certification Account at the above website.
- Students who are undecided or plan to compete at the Division III level need to create a Profile Page.
- Athletes will get an NCAA ID, and will be sent important reminders as they complete high school.
- The NCAA will request athlete transcripts from the high school when needed and we will upload them digitally.

- 6. SELECT ELECTIVE COURSES TO FILL A SEVEN PERIOD DAY (no less than 6 credits through 11th grade)
