Prairie Home R-V Pre-K FAQ's

- When will the Pre-K Program start?
 - The Pre-K program will begin on our first day of school in August of 2024.
- Will there be provided transportation?
 - All students aged 4 or higher will be able to ride the bus to and from school. Students aged 3 will need to be dropped off and picked up.
- What days will the Pre-K be open?
 - The Pre-K will follow the district calendar, observing all off days and any snow days.
- Where will the Pre-K classroom be located?
 - The Pre-K classroom will be housed in the elementary wing.
- Will this be an accredited Pre-K program?
 - As an existing school district, accreditation does not bring as many advantages as it would for a stand-alone business and would require more costs to the district. While we won't be accredited, we will have a classified staff member lead the program following approved curriculum to provide your students with a great jump start to their education.

Will lunch be provided?

 Lunch and breakfast will both be available. Students will pay for food services as they would once in Kindergarten. They will also be able to qualify for free or reduced lunch prices based on economic status.

How much will it cost?

After reviewing our survey, our goal was to give families a competitive or even less expensive option than current child care while also being able to support the program financially. The cost per day will be \$16.67. This results in a monthly cost of \$300, with August and May both being only \$150. Payments will be due on the first of every month with the August being due as a non-refundable deposit upon enrollment.

What will our students learn?

 Our curriculum will follow key pre-k standards. We will also have our Pre-K students participate in our elementary specials rotation, getting to participate in music, PE, art, counseling, and library.

How will enrollment work?

- There will be an enrollment period during the preceding spring of each year, as well as one in the fall if needed to fill the class. A child must be at least three or four years of age to be eligible for Preschool. A yearly enrollment period will be held for registration. The maximum number of students allowed will be 10. The district will make decisions on age cutoffs and potentially having a class of less than ten based on enrollment numbers by age group. Students will be enrolled in the order of the following preferences based on their age prior to Aug 1, 2024:
- Any instances that require the enrollment only a portion of the students in one preference group will be decided on based on the earliest receipts of a completed enrollment packet.


