We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Williams Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school was not identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) School. Also we are not a specialized school.

Williams Elementary School has embraced the District Wide MICIP Goal. It states: Our goal is to create a systematic way for teachers to analyze and use data which will be monitored through a clearly articulated plan to increase student achievement which will follow with 100% fidelity by teachers and leaders.

Students attending Williams Elementary School achieve proficiency at or above state levels. This is partially due to the use of mathematics programs such as Reflex, Eureka Math Squared and Language Arts programs like Reading A-Z. WES also utilizes a tiered approach to its Title I programs where students are evaluated. One of the key

challenges that impacts Williams Elementary School is finding ways to assist our low achieving students. Over the past few years, our Title I program has been restructured to provide the small group and one on one instruction our students need to master the standards set forth by the State. We use several assessments to identify the strengths and weaknesses and use the data we gain to drive our small group instruction.

Through the analysis of student achievement data, attendance data, and behavioral data. This information is used to determine goals, select best-practice strategies, creation of quality curriculum (found at https://www.jonesvilleschools.org/documents) and monitoring progress toward these goals. All plans have been submitted to the Michigan Department of Education

A point of pride for Williams Elementary are the M-Step scores. Students in grades 3-5 score Proficient and Advanced 87.5 % of the time.
