WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN THE MIDDLE SCHOOL ART ROOM?

Ms. Findlay's 6th, 7th and 8th grade students have created truly beautiful art this quarter!
Here are some samples of their class projects.

6th grade students learned abut Gothic Architecture and how Gargoyles helped to protect the foundation of the buildings from rain water.

They designed clay gargoyles based on original examples.

We then looked at African
Adinkra symbols used by the
Ashanti people of Ghana.
These were originally used
for Goodbye Clothes.
Students designed and
carved a block for printing.
They put the prints together,
creating a unique squash
blossom folded book.

7th grade students
learned about the French
Impressionist style of
painting. They chose a
landscape photo as a
reference for developing a
painting in this style.
We then looked at cultural
traditional masks from
around the world.
Students researched a
mask and then made that
mask using plater cast and
acrylic paint.




8th GRADE

choice.














WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN STUDIO IN ART?

Students in Mrs. Labshere's and Mrs. Sheffer's Studio in Art Classes have started the school year by creating some amazing works of art in the classroom and in their sketchbooks! Check out what they've been working on....

The first project was designing a "Logo for You" which involved students selecting a new nickname for themselves based on interests and personality traits!













Then the students went outside to make art with nature! Inspired by the artist Andy Goldsworthy, students worked with various natural materials to make collages and sculptures focusing on the elements of art and principles of design!

Students learned about Pop
Art and how it focused on
aspects of everyday life. They
then thought about their own
personal culture and made
Culture Time Capsule collages
using magazines & print outs.











For the last project of the quarter, students were exposed to Keith Haring, an artist that used simplified people in his artwork.


Students created an artwork focusing on a topic they wanted to show using the same style people.
