The presence of these specialists in a school district is essential for an inclusive and supportive learning environment. Collaboration between these professionals contributes to a support system that empowers students to thrive academically and socially.

#### EXPLORING CLIMATE CHANGE



Mr. Bullock's 8th-grade Science classes have been studying climate change over the last two weeks. They completed a lab to simulate the increasing ocean acidity as we release more CO2 into the atmosphere. The students measured the pH of Hydrochloric Acid and some sparkling water. The students placed a seashell and an egg into each of the liquids. They made predictions about what would happen to the eggs and seashells based on their findings about the pH of the liquids.

#### COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS








#### COMMUNITY SERVICE CLASS SPREADING CHEER

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
