#### From the Principal's Desk

In my lifetime, I have had the fortune to play on two really good sports teams. They were both baseball teams, one in junior high and the other in high school. Neither team won a state championship, but both were able to win some tournaments and end their seasons with successful records.

Being older and looking back at this, I realize now what makes a great team. A great team needs a good leader. My definition of a great leader is one who leads by example. A leader is someone in authority who can resolve conflict positively, is able to get every team member moving in the same direction and is able to "forgive and forget." A leader gets every player to focus on the team rather than self. A good team may or may not have a star, but the team always has someone they can depend on in pressure situations, a player who has been tested and has withstood the test. A good team needs players who know their roles...think Tom Brady's (the New England Patriots') offensive line. Role players possess talents others do not have and do the jobs that no one else wants to do. However, I think the most important attribute of a great team is what Sean Covey (author of the book *The 7 Habits* of Highly Effective Teens) calls a "Win-Win" attitude.

A "Win-Win" attitude is not an attitude that says, "I am going to get mine first. I don't care how well anyone else performs as long as I do well." A "Win-Win" attitude is not a give-in attitude. It is not an attitude with low expectations where it is easier to give-in rather than do what is right. A "Win-Win" attitude is not about revenge. Everybody loses when revenge enters the picture.

According to Sean Covey, a "Win-Win" attitude says, "You don't need to step on others to find success. Success is abundant. There is plenty of success to go around." Looking back at both of my successful baseball teams, I realized we had this "Win-Win" frame of mind.

How can we teach teens to have a "Win-Win" attitude? We can support them while they struggle. When a conflict arises, we can listen to them. We can teach them that their attitude can make the conflict a success or lead to failure, and we can model an attitude that expects positive outcomes.

Sometimes this may take perseverance and toughness on our part, but over the course of time, we can succeed

# News from the 7th/8th Grades Guidance Office 8th Grade Students & Parents.

This is an exciting but often overwhelming time of the school year as we begin to discuss the transition to high school. Below is a timeline of the 9th grade scheduling process. Please keep in mind that the winter weather often disrupts the timeline so it is subject to change over the next few weeks.

**Fri., Jan. 12th:** All 8th graders in regular 8th grade Math will take the HS Math Placement Test. This test along with other data from current 8th grade teachers will be used to create the 9th grade Math recommendation for all students currently in regular 8th grade Math.

**Week of Jan. 16th:** 8th Graders receive the red SHS Course of Studies booklet and view a presentation about the booklet. A link to a parent presentation created by the high school counselors will be posted and emailed.

Week of Jan. 22nd: Students will receive their \*green\* 9th grade course recommendation scheduling sheet in Social Studies class. I will work with them during the

class period on creating a four year plan. This four year plan will be electronic on their google drive for parents to view and help work on at home.

**Jan. 25th-Feb. 9th:** Students can sign up for individual time slots to meet with me if needed. The time slot sign up spreadsheet is posted in the "classwork" section of my 8th grade google classroom. Parents are welcome to join this appt. in person, by phone, or over google meet.

**Fri., Feb. 9th:** The **\*green\*** 9th grade course recommendation scheduling sheets are due to Social Studies teachers signed by parents.

Week of Feb. 12th: I will work with 8th graders during Phys Ed/Wellness/Art classes to electronically submit their 9th grade course requests. I will look over their requests to ensure that they are reasonable and satisfactory at that time.

#### Math Help and Moby Max

On Tuesdays and Thursdays, our weekly schedule affords our seventh and eighth grade students a twenty-five minute extra period called "Connections." Most of the time during connections, students are working on a self-paced math software called "Moby Max." This software is being used to help teachers fill in gaps about math concepts, review and extend concepts. Students are using their chromebooks to complete activities during the time period. #### **From the Nurse**

Happy 2024! As we move into the new year, please note we are still being advised to follow a strict algorithm to keep our school healthy and well. Therefore, if your child wakes up with a temperature over 100 degrees, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea, please keep them home. Please, contact the nurse to receive further instruction. Thank you for doing your part in the bigger picture of keeping our school community healthy and well!

Parents of 6th Graders: The Ohio Department of Health school immunization requirements include a Tdap booster (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis) and meningococcal vaccine (MCV4) before a student enters the seventh grade to protect children from preventable diseases.

These immunizations can be obtained at the Allen County Department of Health. Their phone number is 419.228.4457 and appointments are available by appointment only. No one will be turned away due to the inability to pay. Once the immunizations are obtained we will need a copy for our school record.

If you refuse the vaccine(s), by state law a signed waiver form needs to be on file for the current school year in order to be compliant. #### **Chromebook Care**

SMS Families please review these with your student. If we take care of the Chromebooks we can ensure their use for years to come and keep this program operational.

- No food or drink or pets should be near the Chromebook, charger, or the case.
- Bring your chromebook to school each day fully charged. A good strategy is to plug it in as soon as you finish your homework for the night, but leave it in your backpack to charge. This way you won't forget it!:)
- When moving the Chromebook use two hands.
   Do not pick it up by the monitor.
- Never pile items on top of your Chromebook.
- Lock your Chromebook when it is not in use.
- Protect your Chromebook from exposure to extreme heat or cold.
- Sign out and shut down daily or at least once a week at a minimum for operating updates.
- Do not put any stickers on the Chromebook or remove the school asset tag.
- Only clean the screen with a soft dry anti-static cloth or microfiber cloth.
- Remember you are responsible for any damage to the chromebook, charger, and case and will have to pay to repair it. If something comes up missing you are responsible to pay for it.
- The \$30 chromebook insurance payment is required for ALL students regardless of Free/Reduced Status.
