The Beavers scored the only touchdown in the second quarter when Weston Kayser scored on a 31 yard pass from quarterback, Jayce Slaba.

L-F made a surge in the fourth, scoring four consecutive touchdowns and narrowing the lead for the Beavers. Toward the end of the fourth, Havden Schroeder made an interception and scored on a 68 yard run. Slaba connected with Schroeder for the conversion. Final score was Hanson 50, L-F 32.

The Beavers tallied a total of 347 yards with 286 yards rushing and 61 yards passing.

Leading the team in offense was Tuttle with 144 yards on 14 carries and four touchdowns. Dewald had 13 carries for 82 yards, one reception for 31 yards, and one touchdown. Kayser had 60 yards on four touches and one reception for 30 yards.

Tuttle led the team in tackles with 12 followed by Dewald with six. Kayser marked six tackles while Stetson Riggs had 5.5 tackles. Radek Jarding added five
