

Beavers Suffer Tough Loss to Parkston in Quarterfinal Game

The Hanson Beavers were on the road to Parkston on Thursday, October 26, for a quarterfinal playoff game against the Parkston Trojans.

The first quarter was a defensive battle with neither team finding the endzone.

The first score of the game came in the second quarter when Parkston's Carter Sommer got a safety when he blocked a punt. During the second, Parkston's Brayden Jervik scored on a two yard run and a four yard run. Half-time score was Hanson 0,

Parkston 14.

Jervik scored a third time in the third quarter on a two yard run. Luke Bormann made the conversion, putting the Trojans up, 22-0.

In the fourth quarter, Parkston's Gage Reichert scored a final touchdown for the Trojans when he ran in from eight yards out. Final score was Hanson 0, Parkston 28.

The Beavers had a total of 110 yards with 102 yards rushing and eight yards passing.

Brock Tuttle led the offense with 18 carries for 75 yards. Weston Kayser had seven carries for 18 yards and two receptions for eight yards.

Leading the defense was Tuttle with nine tackles and one fumble recovery. Hayden Schroeder, Carter Endorf, Radek Jarding and Brayden Bahmuller tallied four tackles each on the night.

The Beavers end their season with a 7-3 record.
