The girls shot 16-of-21 (76%) from the charity stripe; and 20-of-50 (40%) from the field.

In the junior varsity game, the Beaverettes beat the Cubs, 43-13, moving their record to 15-4.

Leading the team in scoring was Grace Arend with 13 points. Ava Doyle and Kendra Endorf put up seven points each on the night.

Endorf dished out four assists in the game.

Arend and Doyle marked four steals on the night.
