Dear Parent or Guardian of students in 3-8 & 11:

Testing Season will begin soon. The SD ELA, Math and Science Assessment testing window is March 25<sup>th</sup> to May 3<sup>rd</sup> and is for all students in grades 3-8 and 11. SD Science Assessment is intended for grades 5, 8, and 11. The purpose of this letter is to give you an understanding of the tests and when testing may occur for your student(s). It will also give you a few ideas for helping your student do her/his best on the test.

The South Dakota assessments measure student achievement in relation to our state standards in the areas of English language arts and mathematics, while the SD Science Assessment measures science standards. In addition to providing overall scores in these subjects, score reports will provide information on student performance in early summer to fall.

The assessments are unique in the way they adapt to be appropriate for your child's level of learning. As a result, each student has the same opportunity to succeed and maintain a positive attitude towards testing. These tests are not timed, but we estimate it will take a similar amount of time as did past assessments. We estimate the ELA assessment will take 3.5 hours, the math assessment will take 2.5 hours and science about 3 hours. While your child's grades will not be impacted by their performance on this assessment, this assessment serves as a way for the school to see how well we are helping students meet rigorous learning standards. With the addition of more computers in the elementary, 3-5 will be taking in their classrooms at the teacher's discretion. The middle school (6-8) and 11<sup>th</sup> graders will take each assessment with their teacher who instructs that subject. For example, your student's math teacher will administer the math portion of the assessment during a particular week in their math class period. It is our hope, students will feel more comfortable in this environment and will try harder with that teacher in their presence during the assessment. With this being said, it is imperative students are present during the testing window. Making up a missed test means time out of class and losing important learning time that cannot be made up.

There is no need to study in preparation for the assessments. We do, however ask you to encourage your children to **do their best** and **get plenty of rest the night before the assessment**.
