RES Behavior Interventions

Positive breaks

Some students utilize positive breaks. These can take place in the classroom or in the office if previously scheduled. Students have a list of options they are allowed to do during their break. Some activities involve reading, drawing, or coloring. This is not a break because of a problem behavior they exhibited in the classroom, it is a proactive step to ensure the classroom they are in can have a positive learning environment. This allows the student to gather their thoughts and emotions, so when they go back to class they can be productive. Usually, these breaks will be 10 minutes.

Lunch Detentions

During lunch detentions, students will get their lunch and go to their designated spot. If a teacher assigns a lunch detention, the student will serve the lunch detention in their classroom with their teacher.

Snap Suspensions

If a student exhibits a behavior or behaviors that result in needing a more severe consequence than having time out of the room to refocus, staff may snap suspend the student. This means the student will be sent out of the classroom and to the office, they will stay for the remaining class time. The student will be allowed to go to the next class and resume his/her day as normal. During the student's time in the office for a snap suspension, they will be given work by their teachers at which they are required to work on, they are also required to reflect on their behavior through a reflection sheet or a social skill activity.

In School Suspensions

The administration might enforce a consequence of an In-School Suspension instead of an Out of School Suspension. In this event, the students will be escorted over to the high school where there is a certified teacher who supervises the In School Suspension room and will stay until the end of the day. When entering In-School Suspension the students will be given a folder which they must turn in at the end of the day with, a contract stating the rules and expectations of In-School Suspension and reflection pieces they will have to complete after they have completed all of their school work. Students do not have the privilege of going to any of their classes or activities during the school day. The students will walk down with staff to the Cafeteria, get their lunch and walk back with staff to their assigned location .

After School Detentions

Detentions are scheduled from 3:00 to 3:50. Students that receive After School Detentions, will have their parents called to set up a day and time. The day the detention is scheduled for the student, the student will receive a slip stating they have after-school detention. They are to come to the office immediately after classes are dismissed. Students are required to bring school work with them. Students will complete an activity/restorative lesson revolving around why they received the detention. They will then work on any school work they have.
