

# **Vision & Hearing Screening**

# **School Screening**

School health personnel perform vision and hearing screening of students. The parents of a child may request a screening at any time. Vision and hearing screening will begin as mandated, on **Tuesday**, **September 5**, **2023**, **for MJH students and on Wednesday**, **September 6**, **for NGS students**. **Illinois mandates hearing screening for all students in grades K-3**; for all students receiving special education accommodations; for teacher or parent referrals; for transfer students; and recommends it for students in all even grades. Vision screening is mandated for students in grades K, 2, and 8; for all students receiving special education accommodations; for teacher or parent referrals; for transfer students; and is recommended for all students in even grades. Re-screening, if necessary, will be done the week of September 18. Preschool students will also receive vision and hearing screening as mandated by the Illinois Department of Public Health. This will be performed the week of September 25.

# **Screenings & Required Exams**

Vision and hearing screenings are not substitutes for a complete eye and ear examination by an appropriate doctor. Your child will not be required to undergo this vision screening if an optometrist or ophthalmologist has completed and signed a report form indicating that an examination has been administered within the previous 12 months and that evaluation is on file at the school.

Your child will not be required to undergo this hearing screening if an audiologist has completed and signed a report form indicating that an examination has been administered within the previous 12 months and that evaluation is on file at the school. This notice is not a permission to test.

Vision and hearing screening is not optional. If a vision or hearing examination report is not on file at the school for your child, your child in the mandated age, grade, or group will be screened.

# **Protocol for Visitors/Guests:**

- All visitors, including parents and siblings, are required to enter through the front door of the building and wait in the enclosed vestibule.
- Visitors should identify themselves and inform office personnel of their reason for being at school.
- If you are dropping off lunches, papers, books, etc., you will leave them on the bench in the vestibule. A staff member will deliver the items to the students. Parents/guests will not be allowed to enter the secured entrance without permission.
- Visitors must sign in, identifying their name, the date and time of arrival, and the classroom or location they are visiting. Approved visitors must wear visitor lanyard identifying themselves as a guest. Visitors are required to proceed immediately to their location in a quiet manner. All visitors must return to the main office and sign out before leaving the school.
- Any person wishing to confer with a staff member should contact that staff member to make an appointment. Conferences with teachers are held, to the extent possible, outside school hours or during the teacher's conference/preparation period.
- Visitors are expected to abide by all school rules during their time on school property. A visitor who fails to conduct himself or herself in a manner that is appropriate will be asked to leave and may be subject to criminal penalties for trespassing and/or disruptive behavior.

Thank you for helping us keep our buildings, staff and students safe and secure.

These protocols/procedures are subject to change at any time the district feels they need to be updated. Our ultimate goal is the safety of our students and staff.

# Tips for a Safe Ride

# At the Bus Stop:

- Arrive early at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive
- Stand 6 feet (or three giant steps) away from the curb while waiting for the bus
- Do not move towards the bus until the door is all the way open
- Check for cars

•

# Around the Bus

- Wait for the stop sign and crossing gate to fully open, make eye contact with the driver
- Check that traffic is stopped
- Cross in front of the bus at least 10 feet (or five giant steps)
- Never walk behind the bus
- If you drop something near the bus, do not pick it up; tell the bus driver instead

# Getting On/Off the Bus

- Wait until the bus has stopped and the door opens before approaching the bus or standing up on the bus
- Use the handrail
- Check that you have all your items

# **Behavior on the Bus:**

- Always listen to the driver
- Stay in your seat, no standing or walking in the aisle
- Keep head, arms and all items inside the bus
- Talk quietly, no loud noises
- Turn volume off or wear headphones with phones, iPad, games, etc.
- · Keep to yourself, be respectable to others
- No eating on the bus
- Clean up all trash
