Keeping your Kids Healthy during Cold and Flu Season

Winter weather means that snow, holidays and the common cold season are in full swing. Most winter illnesses are caused by viruses — including RSV, influenza, and yes... COVID-19. While most cases of winter illness in children are mild, sometimes they can be severe or lead to complications. Thankfully, mild cases can be easily treated and prevented at home.

Keeping the germs away

Do your best to avoid illness by preventing the spread of germs as much as possible. This includes washing hands often - especially after your child comes home from daycare or school. Cover your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing. Similarly, avoid touching your mouth, nose and eyes. Many viruses can survive on dormant surfaces, so regularly disinfect hard surfaces, commonly touched objects (such as doorknobs and light switches) and toys. Do not share towels or wash cloths with a sick person.

Symptoms and treatment

These viruses can lead to many symptoms ranging from a runny nose to difficulty breathing. It is also important to remember that for most instances of the common cold, antibiotics will not help as antibiotics are for a bacterial illness only. Here are symptoms to watch for:

Symptoms

Runny nose or nasal congestion

Treatment

For nasal congestion, use nasal saline drops before suctioning your little one's nose. Saline helps to loosen up the mucus and allow you to get more out when suctioning. This can be especially helpful before feeds or a nap.

For older children and adults, nasal saline sprays can also loosen nasal secretions and moisten the nasal lining. If tolerated, sinus rinses can be a great remedy to rid congestion.

Difficulty breathing, coughing and wheezing

A cough is the body's natural way of protecting the lungs from mucus build-up. **Do not** give cough suppressants to most children. If you are considering giving honey as a home remedy, remember that honey should never be given to a child less than one-years-old.

Sipping water or warm tea can help suppress a throat tickle.

If your child has a barky cough or is diagnosed with croup, try having them breathe in the cold air outside or from the freezer. Keep in mind that it is common for a cough to last weeks after initial illness; try to be patient.

Fever

Tylenol or Ibuprofen. Remember that fever is the body's mechanism for fighting a virus or bacterial infection. You do not need to treat the fever. Treat the child. If the child is uncomfortable with fever, treat with fever-reducing medicine. If they are not and the fever is not above 102 degrees rectal, you may not need to treat it. Let the fever do its work.

Do not give aspirin

Dehydration

Increase intake of fluids like water. Make sure your child is urinating at least 3-4 times in a 24-hour period. If the child cannot drink without vomiting, try giving sips every 5 minutes. If vomiting continues, seek medical help

Loss of appetite

It is okay if your child does not want to eat solid foods, however it is important that they continue to drink plenty of fluids like water.

Sore throat

For the older kids, cough drops/lozenges and gargling salt water can help soothe sore throat

Don't fall for common cold myths

There are many myths that surround the common cold, so don't be fooled! The color or consistency of your child's mucus is not indicative of a bacterial infection. It is okay to receive vaccinations when mildly ill or with a low-grade temperature. And contrary to my own mother's advice, you don't catch a cold from simply going outside with wet hair and drinking a lot of orange juice will not prevent you from getting sick.

Most cases of the mild cold can be safely treated at home with a few easy remedies and supportive measures. The most common complications requiring immediate attention or evaluation include dehydration, respiratory distress or secondary infections. So, keep track of your child's urinary output and monitor for signs of increased difficulty breathing (including fast and heavy breathing, using the muscles between the ribs to breath or flaring of the nostrils). Bring your child in for evaluation if the illness lasts longer than two weeks, if fevers last longer than four days or if your child seemed to be doing better before they got worse again.

FOLLOW UP CARE

After a child is assessed, regardless of the outcome of the assessment, the child is assigned a case worker for 90 days of service eligibility.

We encourage families to contact schools to continue follow up with the worker to coordinate care if child and parent were willing to sign consent at the time of assessment.

PARENTAL CONSENT

- It is required that a parent/guardians be available to provide consent.
- Physical presence in the home by a parent/guardian is required. Be prepared to provide a time and location for evaluation.
- For non-english speaking families, a translator can be requested in your native speaking language.



PROVIDE SAFE LOCATIONS

 Be aware that assessments can take several hours in some cases. Ensure that as the parent/guardian you are able to be near the child until the assessment and recommendations have been concluded.



PLACING THE CALL

- Call CARES (1-800-345-9049).
- Provide detailed information about statements the child has reported or behaviors the child is presenting that warrant parent/guardian concern.
- Please share if the student has made any suicidal, homicidal, self-harm, or other threatening comments. Be specific with workers, quote or provide examples when able.
- If you are concerned that your child is using substances, be prepared to share specific information on regarding your concerns (behaviors, type of possible substance, if you have found substances)
- If you or your family feel unsafe with the child in the home, please share this information with the worker.

If you feel this is a medical emergency or you are in immediate danger, please call 911
