Raising the Bar

The mission of Oglesby Public Schools is defined as "all children can learn." In addition to the mission we have a vision that we can meet that mission by providing "each of its students with an appropriate and diverse instructional program."

Recently, Washington School staff went through and did a hard examination of each student's academic data (IAR scores, iReady scores and classroom grades). Each of the teachers were presented with this data and instantly started to reflect on their practices, intended outcomes and expectations within their classrooms. We are holding data meetings throughout the year to review these data points, as well. The purpose of these meetings is to keep our intended outcomes in line with the various data sets that are generated by students throughout a year. Each child receives diverse instructional programming to support them in their efforts to meet those outcomes.

Our biggest takeaway from this most recent examination is that we identified that our learners are needing more of a challenge from us, academically. The students have responded very well to our first trimester offerings with solid marks by a large portion of the population. Those increased grades, GPA and honors designations leads us to believe we need to respond by raising our bar in an effort to meet our mission that we "will strive to provide those ingredients needed to build a solid foundation" and to build that foundation we must raise our expectations and intended outcomes.

In order to receive holiday food baskets, you must register as a client prior to the holiday distribution. www.ivfoodpantry.com.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Illinois Valley Food Pantry is located at 122 Wright St. LaSalle, Illinois 61301. Phone = 224-3658. For regular monthly orders, pick-up days are Mon. from 9:00 a.m. -12:00 p.m., Wed. 3:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m., and Fri. 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

If this is your first time ordering or picking up from the Illinois Valley Food Pantry, you will need to stop by and fill out a form. The hours are: Monday and Friday (9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.), Wed (3:00 p.m.-6:00 p.m.), and closed on Sat.

On your first visit bring the birthdates of all persons living in your household, proof of address, and a photo ID.

Notice: Admission for Homeless Children

Under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, any homeless child shall be immediately admitted, even if the child's parent/guardian is unable to produce records normally required for enrollment. A homeless child may attend the District school that the child attended when permanently housed or in which the child was last enrolled. A home child living in any District school's attendance area may attend that school. The child shall have access to the same free, appropriate public education as provided to other children, including a public preschool education.
