ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS



Lapeer County Literacy Cohort Professional Learning Series- Shoring up foundational skills in students (specifically phonics and decoding; COVID created "swiss cheese" in students' foundational skills). Over 13 hours of professional learning with embedded book study of "How To Plan Differentiated Reading Instruction K-3" by Walpole and McKenna.

2nd grade Cohort 2021-22: Susan Raymer, Beth Highley, and Karen Roys attended. By implementing strategies from the professional learning cohort, our 2nd grade had a decrease in 25% at-risk readers from Fall to Spring. (63% of Dryden 2nd graders had IRIPs in fall of 2021, 38% in Spring; <u>Dryden's 2nd grade showed the biggest gains/improvement over any other district's 2nd grade.</u>

1st and 3rd grade Cohort 2022-23: Jamie Adams, Rebecca Lowe, Jessica Bonesteel, and Breanne Palmerini. We are excited to expand the learning and continue shoring up foundational skills in all 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grade classrooms. (Beth is continuing to use strategies with resource students, as well as Karen with intervention students she sees.)

BK and Kindergarten Cohort 2023-24: Alayna Medley, Vanessa Campbell, and Alyssa Russell. We will learn more about foundational skills and Literacy Essentials #4 and #5 using research supported practices, K-PALS instructional resource, as well as a book study to target phonemic awareness and decoding to accelerate student learning.

Data Analysis Days w/ Teachers 3x a year- Facilitated by coaches Karen and Kristal, teachers have time to analyze student data, form flexible groups, and plan for intentional instruction.

Super Summer Success (reducing the summer slide)- students choose up to 6 books to take home for summer reading at the end of the school year; scheduled book swaps throughout the summer.

DES 2023-24



2023 Dryden High School

Summer School Credit Recovery & Advancement Program

Dryden High School is offering online credit recovery and/or advancement for students enrolled in Dryden High School in order to provide students with a medium for achieving academic credit. This opportunity will allow students to work at their own pace to complete necessary academic requirements.

- Each online course is designed to be the equivalent of approximately 60 hours of instruction.
- Students will be required to attend ALL course sessions (3 hours per day) and spend at least 4 additional hours weekly working on course requirements Late arrivals or early departures are considered an absence.
- Students must spend a minimum of ten hours (10) a week on their online ocurse. However, performing well on the course "pre-test" can significantly reduce the number of hours necessary to complete the course.
- The coursework will be accessible within 24 hours of receiving completed paperwork.
- All coursework and assessments must be completed by the last session. If these are not completed, the student will not be allowed to take the final exam. There are no exceptions.
- If the course is not completed in the allotted number of days, the student will earn a failing grade. There will be no extensions or incompletes.

All sessions meet from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. the following days (Tuesdays and Thursdays):

- June 15th
- June 20th and June 22nd
- June 27th and 29th
- July 6th (NO SCHOOL JULY 4th)
- July 11th and 13th
- July 18th and 20th
- July 25th and 27th
- August 1st and 3rd

(Final course exam will be taken no later than August 3rd)

Cost:

Each course is free for Dryden High School students. There is a fee of \$100 for any out of district students.

Additional Information:

- If students successfully complete a course early, they are no longer required to attend course sessions.
- Either Mrs. Fleming or Mrs. Finnigan must approve courses.




JUNIOR HIGH ADVISORY & HIGH School Seminar

Each teacher meets with a small cohort of students for the first 15 minutes of each day to support Social and Emotional Learning. Students will be working through a series of lessons and journal activities in support of learning and practicing character strengths and virtues. These include topics such as kindness, integrity, teamwork, perspective, etc.

Each student is paired with a caring adult for the entire year.

EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAMS

Kory Lohrmann was hired in 2022-2023 as our new Director of Early College Programs to support student success in concurrent enrollment, dual enrollment, and early college programs.

So far, our students are taking 505 college credits for the Fall 2023 semester.

We are also offering nine onsite college courses this year.



Earn an Associate Degree, 60+ transferrable credits, or a program certificate while in high school.

ENGLISH & MATH ESSENTIALS CLASSES

English & Math Essentials Courses were added for each 7th Grade student.

Each student will rotate through a series of four elective course during the 7th hour period: English Essentials, Math Essentials, Esports, and Physical Education

English Essentials will cover basic grammar, reading, and writing skills

Math Essentials will cover basic skills such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, decimals, percents, etc

By double dosing students in these core classes we will help them build their skills and confidence in English and math.






ALEKS ADAPTIVE MATH PROGRAM

ALEKS helps students master course topics through a continuous cycle of mastery, knowledge retention, and positive feedback. Each student begins a new course with a unique set of knowledge and prerequisite gaps to fill. By determining the student's baseline of knowledge, ALEKS creates an individual and dynamic path to success where students learn and then master topics.

We are currently using ALEKS with all junior high students.
