AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM



HOME INTERNET ACCESS IS IMPORTANT FOR EVERY STUDENT'S SUCCESS.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides eligible households with up to a \$30 discount off their monthly internet bill or a \$75 per month discount on Tribal lands. It also provides one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider when the eligible household contributes at least \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase.

YOU MAY QUALIFY IF YOUR STUDENT RECEIVES FREE OR REDUCED SCHOOL LUNCH OR BREAKFAST!

Does your student participate in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision?

IF THE ANSWER IS YES, YOUR HOUSEHOLD IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM.

You may also qualify if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or a member of the household participates in certain federal assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, SSI or WIC, or Tribal assistance programs.

Lifeline program participants also automatically qualify for the Affordable Connectivity Program.

TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

- 1.Go to GetInternet.gov to submit an application or print a mail-in application
- 2. Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete. Eligible households must <u>both</u> apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.





SENIORS: DON'T FORGET ABOUT SENIOR CONFERENCES!

Seniors still have one more term to get their required Senior Conference scheduled through Mrs. Teply to meet with their assigned School Counselor. **The deadline to have this completed is Friday, December 15th.** Students are responsible for scheduling their own conference that can be held during Advisory or during an open block; students will not be allowed to miss class for a conference. This is a student led conference, parents/guardians are not expected to attend.

During these conferences we will go over post-secondary plans, information on the ACT, FAFSA, the post-secondary education application process and much more. This is an excellent opportunity for seniors to get their questions answered and to make plans for a successful and productive senior year.

SD COLLEGE ACCESS CAMPAIGN

South Dakota seniors have one more month to apply to any South Dakota post-secondary institution for FREE. The SD College Access Campaign will end on November 30th. Seniors if you have not submitted your applications, be sure to do so before November 30th to save some money!

Remember, once a college application is submitted, be sure to fill out the online Transcript Request Form, found on the **Student Services Webpage**, so that your official transcript is sent to that college. College applications cannot be processed without your high school transcript!

Be sure to see your assigned School Counselor if you have questions.

24-25 FAFSA

Reminder that the online application for the NEW and IMPROVED 24-25 FAFSA will open sometime in late December.

EVEN MORE SENIOR NEWS

NCRC EXAM

ALL seniors will take the NCRC Exam on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>December 6th</u>. Students must earn a Silver certificate or higher on this exam as one of the requirements to earn the Advanced Career Endorsement on their final transcript.

The ACT National Career Readiness Certificate is an assessment-based credential powered by ACT WorkKeys. Issued at four levels, the ACT NCRC measures and certifies the essential work skills needed for success in jobs across industries and occupations. The ACT NCRC is widely used by employers, educators, workforce developers, and others with a stake in the success of the economy. More than 2.8 million ACT NCRCs have been issued nationwide since the credential was introduced in 2006.

This exam is a great addition to the student's resume, and is also a part of the Build Dakota Scholarship application. The Build Dakota Scholarship is a FULL RIDE scholarship to a South Dakota Technical School, if the student enrolls in one of the high need programs identified at that institution. One of the questions on the scholarship specifically asks if the student has taken the NCRC exam.


EARLY GRADS!

I'm excited to tell you about an addition to our Dakota Dream's Online Tutoring Program for the 2023–2024 school year. Dakota Dreams is now offering two amazing learning opportunities, Tutor Tracks and Homework Help.

TUTOR TRACKS (1ST-8THGRADE)

Tutor Tracks is a seven-week, guided tutoring program, available for students in grades 1–8, designed to fi rm up your student's foundations in Reading, Grammar or Math. These sessions are scheduled for 30 minutes, twice a week, with tutor-led lesson plans.

HOMEWORK HELP (K-12TH GRADE)

Dakota Dreams offers online tutoring for homework help on an as-needed basis for K–12 students. Sessions can be scheduled ahead of time or accessed on-demand during program hours as students need help or have questions on schoolwork.

These two programs are staffed with university students pursuing education degrees at Black Hills State University and Northern State University.





SPRING 2024 DUAL CREDIT REGISTRATION OPENS NOVEMBER 1ST

Dual Credit is an amazing opportunity for high school juniors and seniors who meet admission requirements, to enroll in public post-secondary school in South Dakota, and earn BOTH high school credit and college credit. Students can take Dual Credit courses for the LOW price of \$48.33 per credit hour.

SEMESTER TWO REGISTRATION PROCESS

- An email has been sent out to all junior and senior students explaining the registration process as well, so be sure to check your school email.
- How students register for Dual Credit with a 4-year college/university depends on if they are currently taking a Dual Credit course this semester or not.
 - Students who are currently taking a dual credit course this semester and are planning to continue to take dual credit courses next semester.
 - <u>Click Here</u>, scroll down to "Method #2: Continuing Registration Form," click on the link for the college you are planning to take a Dual Credit course through, and follow the instructions.
 - Students who have NEVER taken a dual credit course before, OR are currently NOT enrolled in a Dual Credit course for this current semester, the application process is the same as always

 - This packet can also be downloaded from the <u>Student Services Webpage</u>
- How students register for Dual Credit with a Technical College is a slightly different process, and they need to check their school email and follow the instructions from there.

Classes do fill up, so the sooner students turn their Dual Credit applications in, the better chance students have of getting into the class they want.

Deadline to turn applications in to the student's assigned School Counselor is Friday, December 15th.

Reminder that Students/Parents/Guardians are responsible for the cost of the class, as well as any books associated with the course. The Aberdeen Schools Foundation does offer a reimbursement for up to \$50 per class for book purchases, this form can be found on the **Student Services Webpage**.

NORTHERN ACADEMY

at Northern State University

The Northern Academy provides students with an early college experience—including **on-campus** courses, a personalized educational pathway and access to campus support services.

ELIGIBILITY

The Northern Academy is a college readiness program open to high school juniors and seniors who:

- · Are nominated by their high school
- Meet academic criteria for High School Dual Credit (HSDC) established by the S.D. Department of Education and S.D. Board of Regents
- · Attend an Aberdeen-area high school

ACADEMIC AND CAREER BENEFITS

Northern Academy students will take their dual credit courses **on-campus**, taught by full-time Northern faculty. They will also develop personalized, guided pathways to college and career with the support of the Northern Academy Director, the Career Pathways Coordinator and Student Success Center.

FINANCIAL BENEFITS

Northern Academy students will save money with the reduced HSDC tuition rate of \$48.33 per credit. Students who take two classes per semester their junior and senior years of high school, for example, will save approximately \$5,000 in tuition rates.

Other financial benefits include:

- · Free on-campus parking at the Barnett Center.
- All Northern Academy students who complete at least nine credits (three courses) of HSDC and enroll as full-time, degree seeking students at Northern after high school will receive the \$1,000 Dual Credit Scholarship.
- If income-qualified, students will receive a full scholarship for tuition and books from the South Dakota Education Access Foundation for up to nine credits per semester.



FINCANCIAL AID FOR DUAL CREDIT!

South Dakota State University offers the Jackrabbit ACE Scholarship to eligible students who want to take Dual Credit courses through SDSU.

Students who qualify for this scholarship will receive a scholarship that funds one dual credit course (up to five credits) each semester of their junior and senior year of high school and the summer between their junior and senior year. Textbooks and/or course materials are the responsibility of the student.

OPPORTUNITY FOR SOPHOMORES!

Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Seminar (HOBY) is a nationally recognized program that has been in operation since 1958. This is an opportunity available only to high school sophomores. HOBY for South Dakota will take place in June. Selected sophomores from across the State of South Dakota will attend the seminar to be held at Dakota State University in Madison. Central High School will cover the application cost, which covers room and board as well, for TWO sophomores to represent Central High School at the state event. The only thing the student/parents/guardians are responsible for is the transportation to and from Madison.

This is an excellent opportunity for sophomore students and will be a great addition to their resume as they look to apply for scholarships and post secondary admission in the near future.

ASVAB EXAM

The ASVAB Exam is the largest career aptitude test in the nation. It is mostly known for being the exam students must take in order to gain admittance into the military, but it is so much more than that.

Students who take the ASVAB can gain an idea of how they would perform on the ACT or SAT, based off of their AFQT score on the ASVAB.

Students will get connected to an amazing career research tool that allows them to research careers all across the country, looking at job growth, potential salary, educational requirements, and so much more.

This exam will be offered to interested junior and senior students on <u>Wednesday, November 29th at 8am</u> here at Central High School. This exam is FREE to any junior or senior student who wants to take it.

Sign up can be completed online. An email has been sent out to the junior and senior class with registration instructions and the link to sign up.

ACT EXAM

Senior students who still need to take the ACT or need to retake it for a higher score, are strongly encouraged to register for the December ACT exam. Juniors are encouraged to take the ACT in April, but there are a couple test dates prior to April that some juniors opt to take.
