General Summer School Information

Focus

The 2024 District 117 Summer School will offer five types of classes:

- **Credit recovery** for course failures.
- **Credit-bearing** courses for a grade and credit.
- **Enrichment** courses.
- **Bridge** programs in preparation for the fall.
- **Freshman Academy** for selected students.

Location

ALL Summer School courses will be held at Lakes Community High School.

Registration

To register for summer school classes, please scan the QR code and complete the Google form. Registration deadlines vary

– see individual course offerings for details.

Enrollment confirmation will be sent out in May.

Tuition and Fees

Credit-bearing courses are \$225 (per 0.5 credit), except where noted. Please see course details for pricing. Fees will be added to student accounts and must be paid before the start of the course.

All outstanding school fees must be paid in full before enrolling in summer school courses.

Class Limits/Cancellations

Class registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Early enrollment is important since time slots and openings are limited. Classes without sufficient enrollment may be canceled. Community High School District 117 students have priority for enrollment purposes.

Refunds

No refunds will be made after **Monday, June 10, 2024**. Refunds will be applied toward future registration fees within District 117. Refunds will be issued only if the class is canceled due to extenuating circumstances as determined by the principal.

Attendance/Tardy Policy

Summer school is a voluntary regular education program, but students must attend all classes. **Daily attendance is critical to a student's success in summer school.** If a student is ill, the parent/guardian should contact the school secretary at the student's respective building before 8:00 am the day of the absence. For Lakes High School students, the number is 847-838-7623. For Antioch High School students, the number is 224-908-4302. Repeated tardiness will be cause for dismissal from class without credit or refund.

NOTE: Since Summer School hours are limited, daily attendance is extremely important. For Summer Freshman Academy a minimum of fourteen attendance days are required to receive credit. As a rule, students will be dropped from **ANY** summer school classes after two absences due to the compacted time and necessary instructional hours. Please plan vacations and camps accordingly. Exceptions should be appealed to the summer school principal.

Transportation

Bus transportation IS provided for all Summer School students if requested during registration. Students can be dropped off and picked up in the designated areas. Students who are licensed drivers may drive to summer school. Cars driven to campus should not be moved or entered until the students leave the campus at the end of their school day. **Students must park in the student parking lots east of the building. Violators will be ticketed or towed at the expense of the owner.** All vehicles parked on school grounds may be subject to search if the school administration suspects a violation of school rules. Students must register their vehicles with the main office on the first day of school.

Closed Campus

Lakes High School is a closed campus school during summer school hours. Students must remain in the building until their last classes are completed. Students who leave campus during a session or break will be considered unexcused and could be dropped from the course with a loss of fees and credit.

Student Discipline

Rules and regulations of the regular school year are in effect according to District 117 policies. Students removed from class for disruptive or inappropriate behavior may be dropped from the school program with a loss of fees and credit.

BRIDGE/ENRICHMENT COURSES:

SAT/ACT Prep: Cost \$150

June 10 - June 21 8:00 am- 9:55 am or 10:05 am-12:00 pm

Registration Deadline: April 5

Elective 9-12; no credit, no grade

This non-credit course will allow students to hone their SAT/ACT preparedness. During the SAT/ACT Prep program, teachers will help students improve their knowledge base and test-taking skills. Students will attend ten sessions that will acquaint them with the test's expectations, enabling them to analyze their results and sharpen their understanding of key skills covered on the test.

MATH

AP Calculus Bridge Class: Cost - No Charge

June 5 - June 26 8:00 am - 12:00 pm

Registration Deadline: April 5

Elective, no credit, no grade

This non-credit, three-week course for incoming juniors and seniors is by teacher recommendation only. It is designed to bridge the curriculum between Integrated Math 3 Honors and AP Calculus AB or BC and requires a high level of mastery of all previous math classes. Students will be expected to make connections, think abstractly, and provide justifications while working numerically, geometrically, symbolically, and verbally. *A TI-84 graphing calculator is required.*

Integrated Math 2 Honors Bridge Class (Invite Only): Cost - No Charge

June 5 - June 18 8:00 am - 12:00 pm

Registration Deadline: April 5

Elective, no credit, no grade

This non-credit, three-week course is required for students who have completed a middle school Algebra 1 course and want to enroll in Integrated Math 2 Honors - the second-year course in D117's integrated math curriculum. Units in basic geometry, geometric reasoning, one-variable statistics, and two-variable statistics will cover the standards aligned to D117's Integrated Math 1 Honors course that are not taught in traditional Algebra 1 courses. *A TI-84 graphing calculator is required.*

SOCIAL STUDIES

AP History Bridge Class: Cost - No Charge

June 10 - June 21 8:00 am - 9:55 am or 10:05 am - 12:00 pm

Registration Deadline: April 5

Elective, no credit, no grade

This non-credit course is for recommended students who meet the following criteria: students interested in enrolling in either AP European History or AP United States History in the fall. The curriculum will focus on skills that will support success in college level history courses. Skills such as effective reading, and note taking, thesis development, vocabulary development, document analysis, FRQ/DBQ, organization, and use of evidence to support claims will be emphasized.

AP Human Geography Bridge Class (Invite Only): Cost - No Charge
June 10 - June 14 **8:00 am - 9:55 am or 10:05 am - 12:00 pm**
June 20 - June 21 **8:00 am - 12:00 pm**
Elective, no credit, no grade

Registration Deadline: April 5

This non-credit course is recommended for students interested in enrolling in AP Human Geography in the fall. The curriculum will focus on skills including: writing Free Response Questions, analyzing data on maps, charts, and graphs in a college level history course, effective reading and study skills, and more. This course will support AP Human Geography students in being successful critical thinkers in a college level history course.

AP Psychology Bridge (Invite Only): Cost - No Charge
June 10 - June 14 **8:00 am - 9:55 am or 10:05 am - 12:00 pm**
Elective, no credit, no grade

Registration Deadline: April 5

This non-credit course is recommended for students interested in enrolling in AP Psychology in the fall. The curriculum will focus on skills that will support success in college level psychology courses. Skills such as effective reading, writing free response questions, and vocabulary development. This course will help prepare students for AP Psychology and their success in the class.

SCIENCE

AP Biology Bridge Class: Cost - No Charge
June 10 - June 14 **8:00 am - 9:55 am or 10:05 am - 12:00 pm**
Elective, no credit, no grade

Registration Deadline: April 5

This non-credit, one-week course is recommended for students enrolling in AP Biology in the fall. The course will focus on the major Biology content objectives necessary to begin the year in AP Biology.

AP Chemistry Bridge Class: Cost - No Charge
June 10 - June 14 **8:00 am - 9:55 am or 10:05 am - 12:00 pm**
Elective, no credit, no grade

Registration Deadline: April 5

This non-credit, one-week course is recommended for students enrolling in AP Chemistry in the fall. The course will focus on the major Biology content objectives necessary to begin the year in AP Chemistry.

CREDIT BEARING COURSES:

Life Resource Management (LRM): Cost \$225
June 5 - June 26 **8:00 am - 12:00 pm**
Elective 11-12, 1 semester, 0.5 credit

Registration Deadline: April 5

LRM teaches students the skills necessary to live on their own. The majority of the topics covered will be project-based experiences. Topics include consumer rights and responsibilities, money management (including checking and credit), and employment preparation. This course fulfills the Consumer Education graduation requirement.

Personal Finance: Cost \$225**June 5 - June 26 8:00 am - 12:00 pm*****Registration Deadline: April 5******Elective 11-12, 1 semester, 0.5 credit***

Personal Finance helps prepare students for life on their own. Students will gain the knowledge necessary to make wise financial decisions that will benefit their personal and professional lives. The major areas of study will focus on banking, budgeting, obtaining and using credit, renting an apartment, comparison shopping, insurance, financial management, and sources of consumer information. Projects and hands-on activities are a vital part of this course, including the Virtual Business—Personal Finance simulation. This course meets the Consumer Education requirement for graduation.

American Government: Cost \$225**June 5 - June 26 8:00 am - 12:00 pm*****Registration Deadline: April 5******Required 12 only, 1 semester, 0.5 credit***

American Government is designed to provide students with the necessary knowledge and skills to participate effectively in a democratic society. Students will gain a strong understanding of how federal and state governments operate, how the government's actions affect individuals and the role of citizens in the democratic system. Class activities include research and exploration, written projects, discussion of current and controversial topics, and simulations. This class will prepare students for the required examinations on the Illinois and United States Constitutions and meets the state civics graduation requirement.

Driver Education Classroom: Cost \$300**Registration Deadline: January 13**

Driver Education credit, 1 semester, 0.5 credit **At Lakes only for LCHS and ACHS students**
Driver Education Behind-the-wheel dates and times will be released and teachers will work with students to find additional time slots if others are needed.

Students must be 15 by June 1, 2024 to enroll and have adult/guardian permission. Students will be placed in the class based on their birthdates.

This driver education course is an accelerated two-phase program comprising 15 days of classroom instruction and 6 hours of behind-the-wheel (BTW) instruction. Students will attend a 2-hour block of in-person classroom instruction to meet the 30-hour classroom requirement from the State of Illinois. During the first week of classroom, parents and students will sign up to select 6 different dates, spaced out 1-2 sessions/drives per week. Students will select a 2-hour block with a driving instructor, 1 hour of driving training, and 1 hour of observation to meet the 6-hour BTW training and 6 hours of observation requirement from the State of Illinois. In accordance with ISBE, driving must be extended over a minimum of 4 weeks. They will receive driving training once to twice weekly with an instructor. In addition, students should receive at least 2 hours of home practice each week during the course. Driving outside this course is crucial to the completion and success of the student in this program. Enrollment in the course will be selected by birthdate and not by order of sign-up.

Attendance is critical for the in-person classroom component to meet the 30-hour classroom component per Illinois State law requirements. Students will only be allowed one medical or extenuating absence, and proper documentation must be submitted for that absence. After 1 absence, a student will be dropped from the course; if documentation is not provided and any more absences, students will be dropped from the course even for illness.

Attendance for the Behind-the-Wheel portion is critical as teachers' and other students' time is valuable. COVID-related issues will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Students must have a permit on the first day of the course and are eligible to receive a permit 30 days before the start date. Permit testing will occur at the high school before the summer session begins. If the student does not attend that session, they **MUST** visit the DMV to obtain their permit. Students should begin reviewing the Rules of the Road when registering for the course.

- **Note:** There is a separate \$20 permit fee required by the Secretary of State in Illinois. Further information about permit testing will be shared later in the spring.
- **Prerequisite:** Successful completion of eight courses within the past two semesters.
