Community– The Chatham Central School District, composed of the Village of Chatham and several other rural communities, is located in Columbia County. The district is within a 30-mile commuting distance to Albany, New York. The village is a well-established community, residential in nature. One elementary school, one middle school, and one high school serve the approximately 950 students enrolled in Pre-K through grade 12.

School- Chatham High School is a public, comprehensive high school with an enrollment of approximately 350 students in grades 9-12. The student/faculty ratio is 13 to 1. Over 90% of our professional staff have a Master's Degree or higher.

Accreditation- The New York State Department of Education and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Regents Courses- English, Global History, US History and Government, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Spanish.

Advanced Placement Courses- English Literature, Biology, American History, European History, World History, Calculus AB, and Computer Science A. (Pre-AP courses in English and Social Studies)

Dual-Enrollment- The following courses are available for students to earn college credit: Advanced Placement US History and Government, Spanish 4 and 5, Accounting, Psychology, Sociology, Computer Applications, Business Law, Environmental Science, and Economics.

New Visions Programs through Questar III: Students may earn college credit while completing a concentration in a career focused program at an area college or hospital.

Accelerated Programs- in Mathematics, Science, and Foreign Language begin for eligible students in Grade 8.

Grading System- A 100-point numerical grading system is in effect. Course grades are the straight numerical average of all quarter grades and final/Regents exams. Minimum passing grade is 65. A cumulative weighted Grade Point Average ("Wt GPA" on transcript) is computed for each student. This average is used in determining class rank.

Accelerated and Pre-AP final course grades are weighted 3%. All Advanced Placement final course grades are weighted 6%. The weighted Grade Point Average is computed as follows: each weighted grade is multiplied by its credit value; the grades are then totaled, and divided by the number of credits attempted. Student Rankings are reported in 5% intervals.
