TERMS AND CONDITIONS

General Terms

- 1. The parties to this agreement are the resident school district, the attending school district, the parents or guardians of the student(s) identified herein, or the student if he or she is an adult or emancipated student.
- 2. This agreement shall be effective when signed by all parties and shall continue for the remainder of the school year. However, should the student fail to maintain minimum behavioral or attendance standards established by the attending school/district, the transfer approval may be revoked at any time at their discretion. A student whose transfer has been revoked may not apply for a transfer to the same district for the next academic year.
- 3. The parties agree that the student shall be enrolled and shall attend school in the attending school district for the remainder of the school year as provided under Oregon Law. A student may remain in the attending district for a period of time following a move to a new district. If the student moves midyear, the student may remain enrolled until the end of the year. If the student moves over the summer, the student may remain enrolled for the following school year. Under all circumstances, the interdistrict transfer form must be signed annually.
- 4. The interdistrict transfer form must be completed on an annual basis regardless of prior acceptance. Forms will be made available in the releasing district administrative offices. The releasing district superintendent must sign the interdistrict transfer form to begin the process. It is the parent, guardian, or adult student's responsibility to make application in a timely manner in accordance with both the releasing and attending districts' timelines.

Transportation and Activities

- 1. Neither the releasing district nor the attending district shall be responsible for providing transportation to and from school to the student, unless the student is entitled to receive transportation as a related service under the student's IEP.
- 2. The student's eligibility to participate in interscholastic activities may be restricted by requirements from the OSAA or other approved interscholastic organizations.

Special Education

- 1. If the student is eligible for special education services, the attending district shall provide the student with all services in the student's IEP and shall confer to the student all rights and procedural safeguards under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
- 2. The attending district shall be responsible for providing extended school year services to the student if he or she qualifies for such services.
- 3. The attending district will receive all state funds, as well receive the Federal IDEA allocation for the child under IDEA Part B.
