From the Desk of the Superintendent

Dear Coleman Parents/Guardians, Students and Community Members,

The first half of the year has brought a great deal of fun, excitement and positives to be proud of at Coleman Schools. I'd like to thank our entire community for starting the year out strong and making our early Homecoming one of the best. It was a beautiful night and the amount of community energy and engagement was unmistakable throughout town.

And that momentum has continued with our students and staff with the goal this year of "Cultivating Comet Connections." Community connections are everywhere, from our students visiting the Senior apartments to leave positive sidewalk chalk messages, writing nice letters, or helping to serve dinner, to others who helped decorate windows downtown, finish fall clean-up jobs at residents' homes, and those who work in our local businesses.

When they aren't connecting with the community directly, our staff is working with students daily, ensuring they are career and college ready. With staff and student combined efforts, every student sets his/her own goals prior to each state and district assessment based on his/her efforts in the previous testing. This practice increases students' understanding of the importance of the learning, knowing their goal, and knowing how far they can reach. With this focus, we have seen impressive gains by a large group of our students each time. There is strong pride from students and staff alike in the advancements and progress being made. The goal-setting will build on the progress we saw with the School Index Data from the State posted at www.mischooldata.org, which is available for the 2022-2023 school year. The Overall School Index Data there showed an increase from

2021-2022 to 2022-2023 of 25.66 points for the Elementary School, and a 7.07 points increase for the Jr/Sr High School. The increases *within* the Overall Index were seen in the areas of Growth and the School Quality & Student Success for both buildings. While the Jr/Sr High saw a slight decrease of 1.01 points in Proficiency (equivalent to less than one student), the Elementary saw an increase in Proficiency of 7.03 points. (cont. pg. 2) (cont. from pg. 1) Our success cannot be done without you, the parents and community. Recently, many of you took the time to respond to our building perception surveys and the 31aa safety and mental health survey. Your input is greatly appreciated and is being used to develop budgets for various funding sources to ensure we best meet the needs of our students and families. We will share information in upcoming newsletters and short videos to keep you posted on how we've used your feedback. We are also updating our Strategic Plan and will be seeking more input from you; watch for upcoming meeting dates.

Introducing . . . the School-Based Health Center!

MidMichigan Health Services is excited to be opening a School-Based Health Center in the Coleman Elementary School building! The clinic is funded by the Child and Adolescent Health Center Grant through MDHHS. The clinic will be open 24 hours Tuesday through Friday year-round, and will be staffed by a Nurse Practitioner, Stacey Williamson, FNP-C and a Mental Health Therapist. The clinic will provide services to K-12 Coleman students and will offer sports physicals, well-child checks, immunizations, sick visits, treatment for minor injuries and mental health therapy services. Mental health therapy and immunizations will be future services and will be communicated as they become available. The clinic renovations and inspections have taken place. It is anticipated the clinic will be opening late January to early February. A consent form will need to be completed and returned to the clinic for children to receive services. These forms will be available at the clinic once opened. An electronic consent form is also being developed and it is anticipated this will be available on the school's website in the future. Parents/Guardians will receive calls from our School Nurse, Mrs. Weber, or school office staff before accessing the Health Center, or parents/guardians may contact the Center to set up appointments for their child. Staff at the Health Center can be reached at (989) 229-0822.

Winter Safety Tips!

The season you either love — or love to hate — is in full swing. Here are some safety tips to keep your family safe during these cold winter months!

1. **Winter wear should fit kids properly**, but gear shouldn't be so tight that it restricts movement. This is particularly true for footwear. Too-tight boots constrict blood flow, causing feet to become even colder.

2. When sending kids off to school or out to play, **make sure they're dressed warmly in layers that are wind- and waterproof.** Help your kids to stay warm with adequate head, face, hands, and neck protection, hats should fully cover ears!

3. **Driving in winter can be dangerous, so you should make sure you're ready for any situation.** Prepare your car for such emergencies by keeping the following must-haves in your trunk: a first-aid kit, blankets, shovel, rock salt, ice scraper, water, and nonperishable snacks.

4. **Always supervise your child's winter activities.** Ice skating should only be done on ice that has passed proper inspection. Sledding paths shouldn't be too crowded or too close to roadways. The safest sleds are those that allow for steering, so avoid snow tubes or disk-shaped sleds. If your little ones want to try skiing or snowboarding, consider getting lessons from an instructor. While out on the slopes, they should always wear helmets and gloves with built-in wrist guards, and be accompanied by an adult.

5. Avoid or limit outdoor activities when the temperature nears or falls below 5 degrees **Fahrenheit.** Take frequent breaks indoors from the cold.

Coleman Regional Agriscience Center & Culinary at The Depot

Will you be in 10th, 11th, or 12th grade during the 2024 - 2025 school year? Do you enjoy lessons that are hands-on? Would you like to earn some of your math or science credits while learning about hundreds of potential careers?

The Coleman Regional Agriscience and the Coleman Culinary at The Depot are Career-Technical Education (CTE) programs. These programs are available to all Midland County Students (Bullock Creek, Coleman, Meridian, Midland High and Dow High) through a County Consortium and transportation is provided. Homeschool students, private school students, and students from surrounding counties are also more than welcome to enroll with us for just two hours a day. Both programs offer outstanding teachers in a hands-on environment where you can gain industry certifications, high school credits, skills, and internships. Students can also choose to join our Early/Middle College program as a 5th year student and earn an Associate Degree for free! Students in the Agriscience program can earn credits for Ag to MSU while participating in FFA state and national competitions.

The Culinary program is held at the former "Yesterday's Depot" restaurant with an industry-level kitchen where students will learn the skills of the trade, make connections in the culinary world, and earn high school credits all while delving into sales, marketing, business, and operations. By 2030 in the State of Michigan alone, there will be over 182,000 openings for careers in Food Services, Accommodations, Leisure, and Hospitality and Food Manufacturing.





The Agriscience program boasts a fully-functioning barn and greenhouse, a 7.16-acre outdoor land lab, an 80-acre forest lab and STEM classrooms, all manned and designed by students in their areas of interest. There are over 250 different career connections in areas such as: plant and animal systems; power structural & technical systems; engineering, manufacturing, GIS/GPS, drone training, natural resources; food products and processing systems; environmental service systems, and agribusiness. Thousands of these positions go unfilled every year right here in Michigan!


