EARLY DECISION AND EARLY APPLICANTS TYPES OF COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE

ED applicants (If you know for certain you are attending (i. e. family alumni)

- · Apply early (usually in November) to first-choice college.
- Receive an admission decision from the college well in advance of the usual notification date (usually by December).
- Agree to attend the college if accepted and offered a financial aid package that is considered adequate by the family.
- Apply to only one college early decision.
- Apply to other colleges under regular admission plans.
- Withdraw all other applications if accepted by ED.
- Send a nonrefundable deposit well in advance of May 1.

EA applicants (if you are not certain)

- Apply early.
- · Receive an admission decision early in the admission cycle (usually in January or February).
- Consider acceptance offer; do not have to commit upon receipt.
- Apply to other colleges under regular admission plans.
- Give the college a decision no later than the May 1st.

INFORMATION ON COLLEGE AND MILITARY VISITS

- Throughout the year FHS invites representatives from other colleges to visits with FHS students about their college choice. All visits are listed in the daily FHS announcements and online at FHS website.
- Students need to sign-up in the counseling office to be excused from class to visit with representative.
- Men do **not** need to register with selective service for financial aid when you turn 18 years of age but it is still recommended. (Selective Service registration is no longer required to receive federal financial aid, it is still required for almost all males (according to their sex assigned at birth) ages 18-25. ... If you don't register with the Selective Service, you won't be eligible for federal job training or a federal job. Aug 13, 2021 https://www.sss.gov/Home/Registration/Registration

- Your FSA ID* (7 points to know) FAFSA NIGHT SCHEDULED FOR 01/31/2024 AT COLLEGE NORTH RR CAMPUS
 - An FSA ID is a username and password that you can use to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education (ED) websites. Each student, and one parent of each dependent student, will need an FSA ID to complete the FAFSA process on fafsa.gov. We recommend creating your FSA ID early—even before you're ready to complete the FAFSA form—to avoid delays in the process.
 - IMPORTANT: Do NOT create an FSA ID on behalf of someone else. That means parents should not create FSA IDs for their children and vice versa. Doing so may result in issues signing and submitting the FAFSA form and could lead to financial aid delays. (Also, it's against the rules to create an FSA ID for someone else.)

- Your driver's license number
- Your 2022 tax records (Two Years Ago) Starting College In Fall 2024!
- Records of your untaxed income
- Records of your assets (money)
- List of the school(s) you are interested in attending

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

- 1. Scholarship applications (due April 5th unless otherwise noted) Most scholarships require the following:
 - a. Student's resume
 - b. Minimum of 2 recommendation letters ask for these early!!
 - c. Copy of college acceptance letter
 - d. Essay on future plans and goals
 - e. Unofficial copy of high school transcript transcript includes all (high school and/or college) student's courses and grades for grades 9-12, weighted and non-weighted GPA, class ranking, ACT/SAT scores, and immunizations (be sure to check what immunizations are required at student's college choice. Any updates can be given to Nikki in the Counseling Office to update the record).
- Type application unless otherwise noted.
- Scholarships: as they become available are listed in the counseling office.
- Updated listings of scholarships are always available on the school's website Under the Guidance and Counseling section.
- Students should contact their specific college choice to see what opportunities are available.

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

- https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/
- Athletes need to be certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center to compete at an NCAA Division I or II school. (NCAA Handout)
- Athletes will need to create a Certification Account at the above website.
- Students who are undecided or plan to compete at the Division III level need to create a Profile Page.
- Athletes will get an NCAA ID, and will be sent important reminders as they complete high school.
- The NCAA will request athlete transcripts from the high school when needed and we will upload them digitally.

HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT

1.High School Transcripts – FHS requires a *written request* for official and unofficial transcripts.

Students should stop in the Guidance Office and complete the form; an e-mail to Nikki Rolando nrolando@isd361.org would be just fine too.

FINAL TRANSCRIPT REQUEST

- Request FINAL TRANSCRIPTS once final grades are posted.
 Students MUST turn this form in to the Guidance Office in order for the transcript to be sent to the student's college choice. If the form is not submitted, the transcript will NOT be sent out (this is for the student's safety and to prevent identity fraud).
- 2. The Counseling Office also has forms to request any Final Transcripts for any college courses that were taken. There may be a small fee from the college for college transcripts.

HONORS INFORMATION

- MN Honor Society Requirements (Inducted Fall Of Junior Year)
 - Minimum 3.80 cumulative GPA
 - 2. Open to qualifying juniors and seniors
 - 3. Must maintain 3.65 cumulative GPA after elected
- Academic Excellence Award Requirements
 - Student that qualify will receive a letter
 - Students need to fill out the form and return it to the office
 - I. Grades 9-10 Minimum 3.70 cumulative GPA
 - 2. Grade II Minimum 3.70 cumulative GPA
 - 3. Grade 12 Minimum 3.70 cumulative GPA (3.80 2025)
- Graduating with honors requires a minimum 3.85 (2024) cumulative GPA. (3.80 2025 f.f.)

FALLS HIGH ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARD

- 1. Falls High School Academic Excellence Awards will be awarded at a ceremony May 8th @ 6:00 p.m.. Students receiving the awards will get an invitation in April. Qualifying seniors will receive a letter in the mail with an application form. Seniors need to have a 3.70 cumulative GPA to qualify to apply.
 - Student will receive a letter if they qualify
 - Student needs to fill out the form and return it to the office
