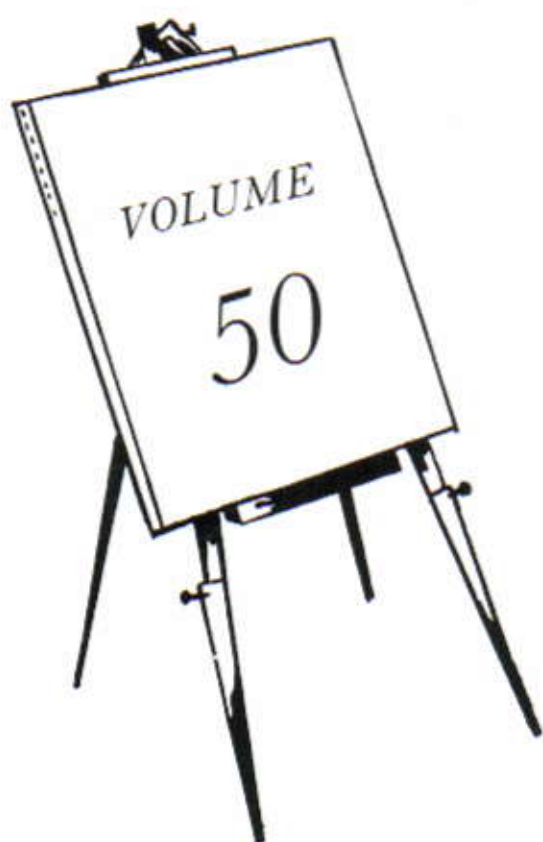

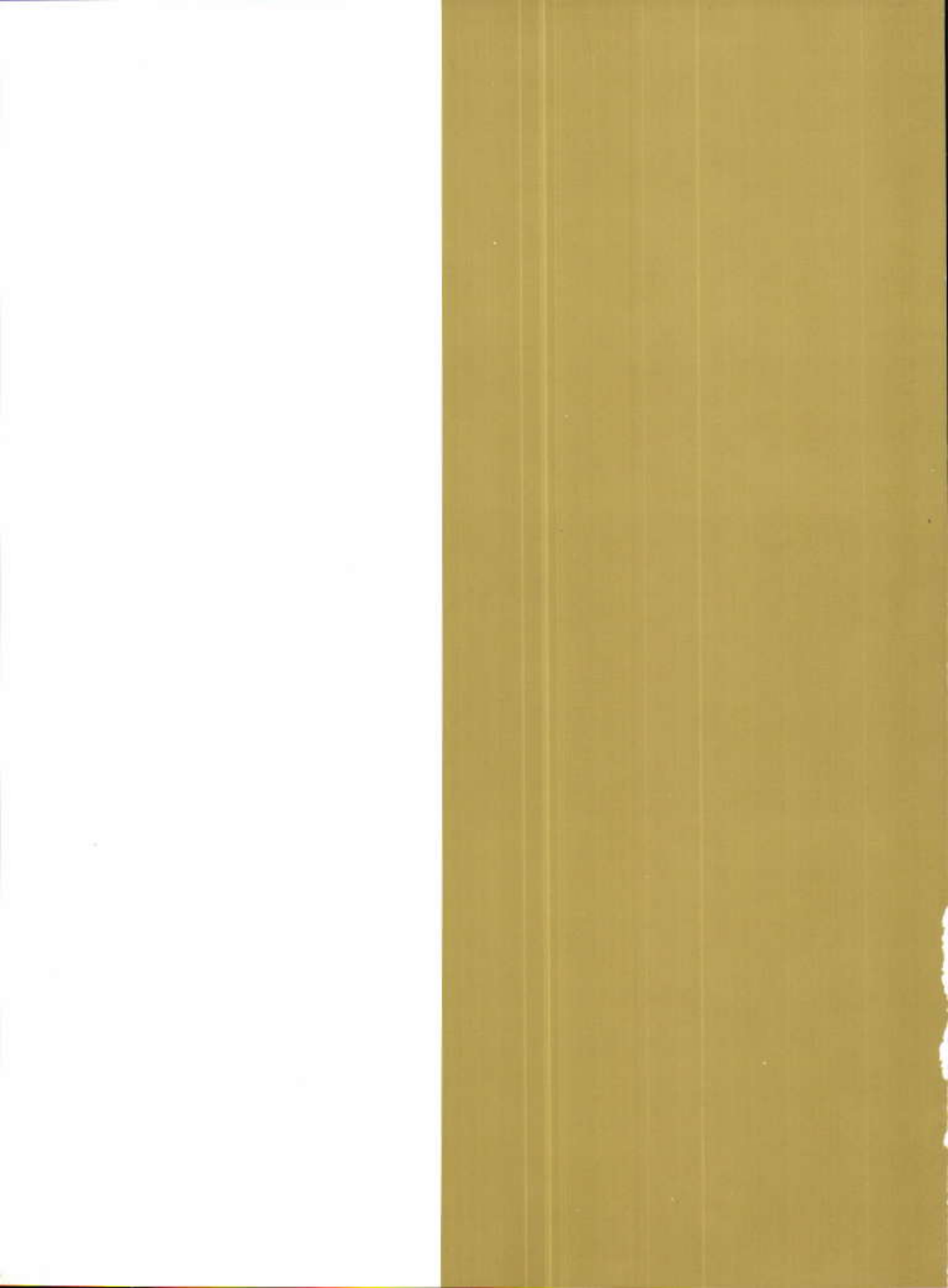

Two Questions You've Asked

— Why Did the Class of '14 Publish a Yearbook?

When in 1914 a senior class of 8 members chose five to edit a yearbook, the editor gave as their motive this, quoted from the 1914 issue. "First, this book is intended to represent the students and their work; secondly, it should act as a medium to advertise the high school throughout the state and finally it should be a trumpet call to arms."

— Why Did They Name It Tuba?

The name Tuba has intrigued many throughout the years. This name too, is explained by the editor of the first issue in these words.

"TUBA is Latin for trumpet. The old Romans used this instrument for sounding signals to the soldiers in battle. After a successful foray, one blast of the trumpet would bring the soldiers up at double quick pace for a division of the spoils. Here is an analogy: We sound our trumpet — *THE TUBA* — calling all soldiers — boys and girls who ought to be students here — for a division of the spoils — to share the chance for education offered by Perryville High School. The difference lies in the fact that in the former, the weaker person did not get his just share of the spoils, while here a student may have just as much as he desires; he gets all he works for. If just one boy heeds the call, comes to PHS and thus finds his place in the world — TUBA '14 will not be in vain. Sona TUBA."

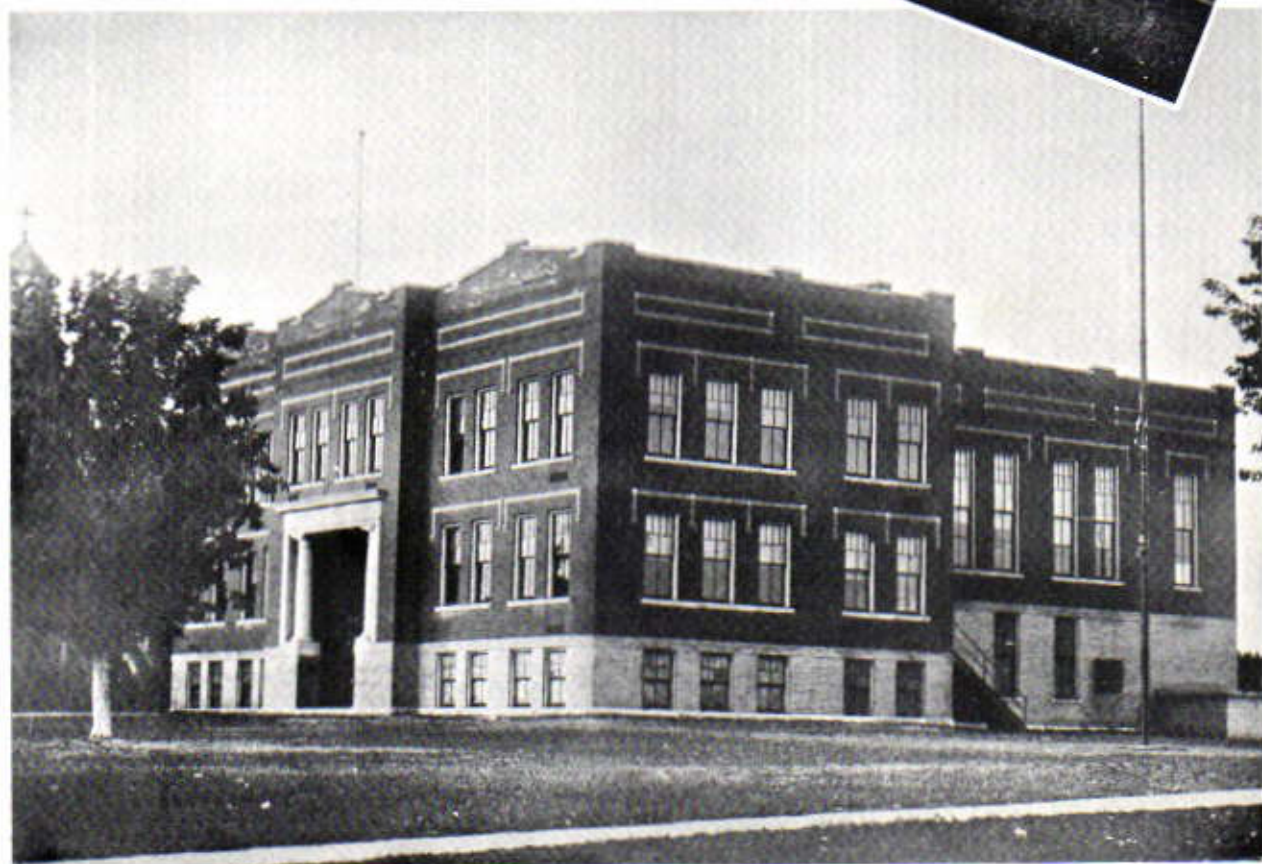

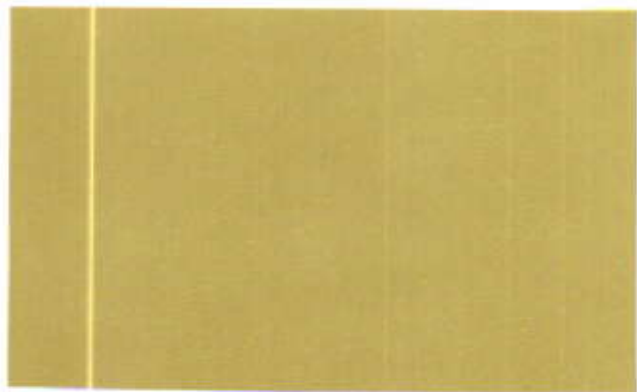

In 1911 Perryville High School was accredited by the state department with 16 units of academic credit aimed largely to satisfy college entrance requirements. Gradually to meet the growing population and demands of the times special departments were added until now we offer 50 units and a varied curriculum — with specialized fields of interest including Business Education, Agriculture, Home Economics, Music, Industrial Arts, and Art.

From three teachers, when the first Tuba was published our faculty has increased to 27 in the Senior High only. Services added have been the school cafeteria; bus accommodations; a full time trained nurse supervising regular visual and audio tests, as well as general health conditions; a guidance director, and special education services.

P.H.S. received AAA rating by the state department in 1959. Dedicated to the best interests of our school the administration keeps a watchful eye on continued growth and instructional improvement so that while maintaining the standards set we will also be taking steps forward.

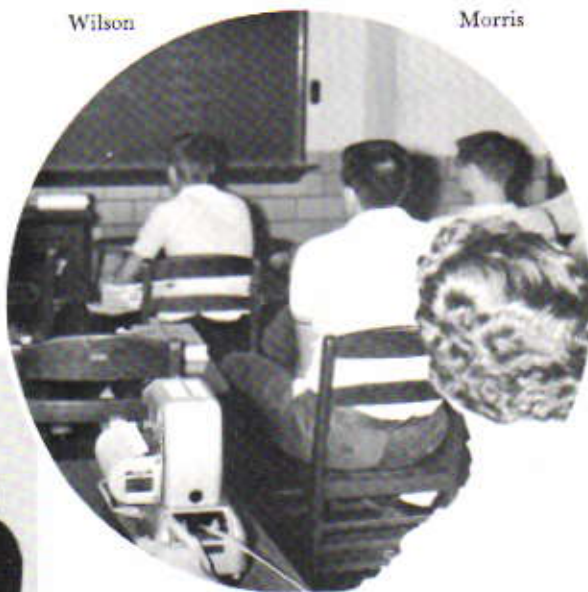

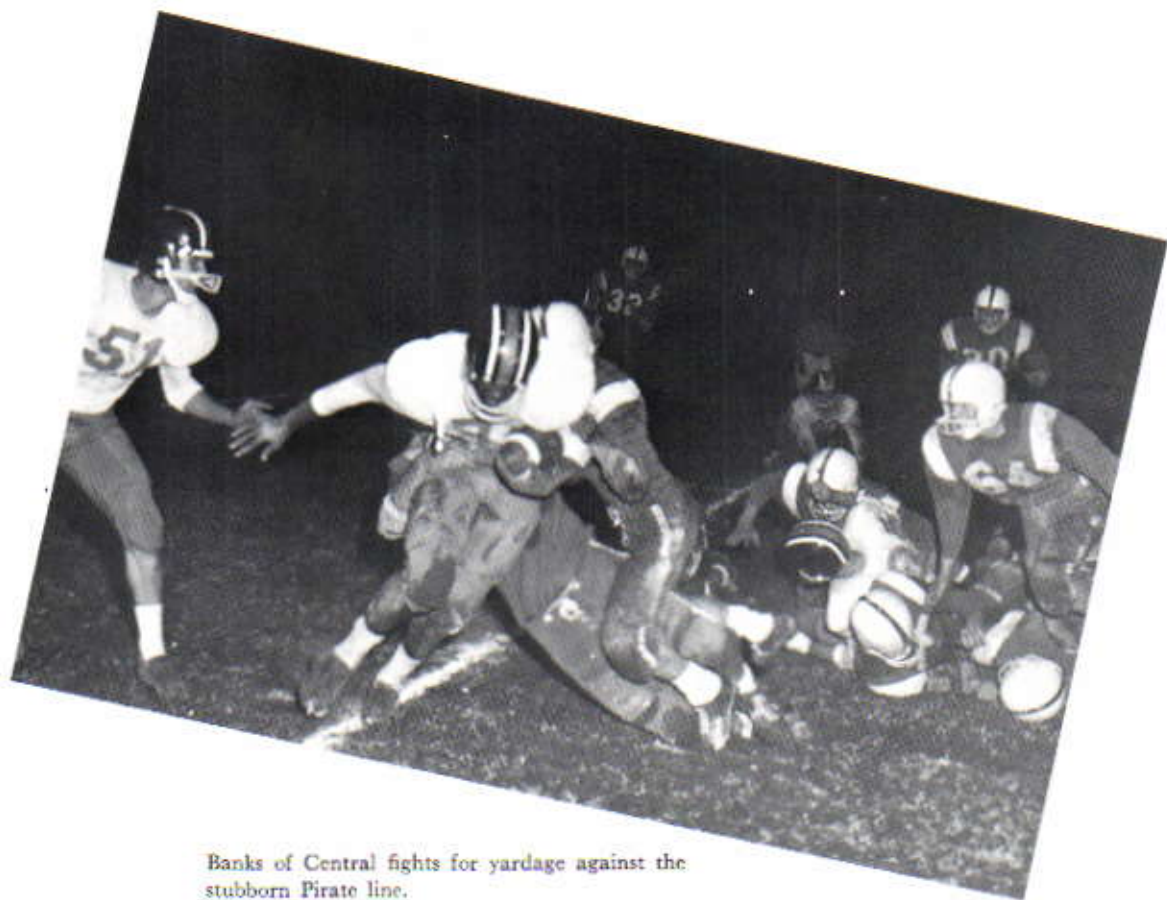

The Pirate track team had one of its best years in the history of the school in the 1963 season. Led by consistently good performances by Ron Hoehn in the hurdle events, Wayne Hennemann in the sprints, Don Brickhaus in the mile and half-mile runs, and the mile and half-mile relay teams, the Bucs won two dual meets and high places in larger meets, including third place in the very significant Jackson Invitational Track Meet.

Ron Hoehn won second in both the hurdle events in the district meet, and the mile relay team, composed of Richard Fritsche, Clinton Detjen, John Schamburg, and Wayne Hennemann placed fourth in the district meet, thus qualifying for the state track meet.

Track is our second oldest sport having been organized in March 1914. A team entered the S.E. MO. track meet at Cape Girardeau in May of that year. This sport rapidly took hold and in 1920, P.H.S. won both the S.E. Mo. meet and the individual high point man.

Between 1945 and 1954 track, except on an inter-class field day basis was discontinued to be resumed in 1956.
