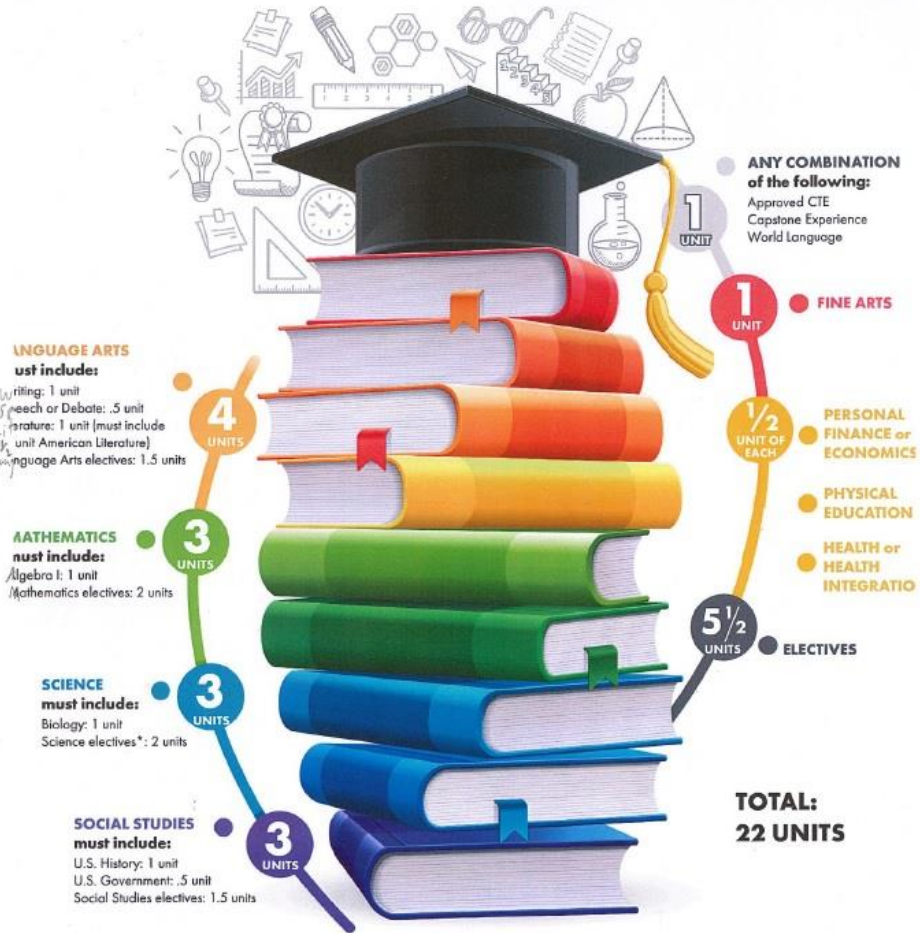

South Dakota High School Graduation Requirement

Approved by the South Dakota Board of Education Standards in July 2018



* A state-approved advanced computer science course may be substituted for one unit of a science elective, but may not replace Biology. A list of approved courses is available at <http://dos.sd.gov/gradrequirements>.

Students are required to meet the above High School Diploma requirements, also known as the 'base diploma'. Students may earn advanced endorsements with their high school diploma. A student's personal learning plan must document a minimum of 22 credits that include the above requirements.

South Dakota High School Graduation Requirement

Approved by the South Dakota Board of Education Standards in July 2018

ADVANCED ENDORSEMENTS

In addition to the base requirements for the High School Diploma, students may earn advanced endorsements that are in alignment with the student's personal learning plan. Advanced endorsements outline specific coursework within the base diploma requirements to denote specific emphases. Students may earn one or more of three advanced endorsements: Advanced Endorsement, Advanced Career Endorsement and Advanced Honors Endorsement.

The requirements beyond the base high school diploma requirements are in red text in each advanced endorsement section below.

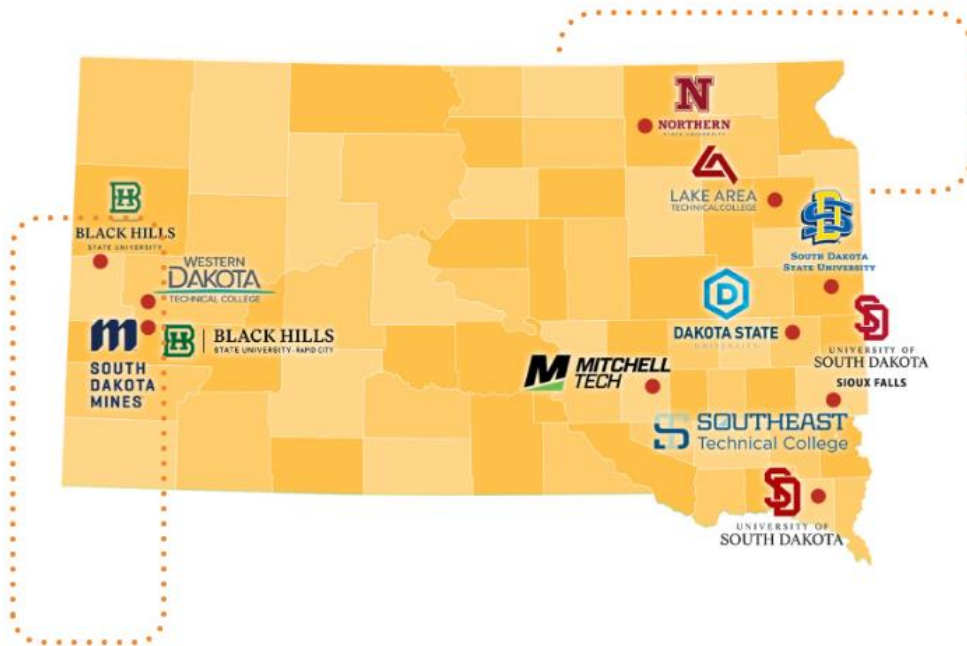

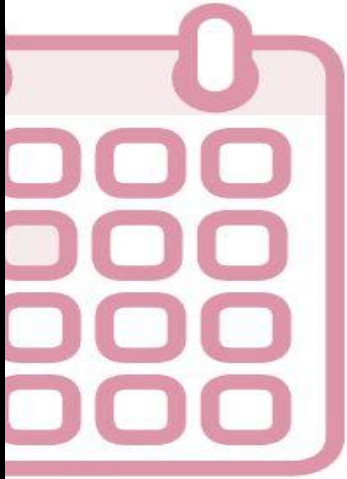
Black Hills State University - Dakota State University – Northern State University – South Dakota School of Mines & Technology – South Dakota State University – University of South Dakota

High school Juniors and Seniors attending a public high school within South Dakota may be eligible to participate in this program and receive both high school and college credit at a reduced rate per credit.

Admission Requirements (Applicants must Meet One of the Four Requirements Below):

1. High School junior eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets one of the following requirements:
 - a. Earn an ACT composite score of 24 reflective of the 70% percentile; or
 - b. Rank in upper one-third of their graduating class; or
 - c. Earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale
2. High school senior eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets one of the following requirements:
 - a. Earn an ACT composite score of 21 reflective of the 50% percentile; or
 - b. Rank in the upper one-half of their graduating class; or
 - c. Earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 on a 4.0 scale
3. High School junior or senior eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets all of the following undergraduate admissions requirements:
 - a. Act score of 18 (or of 21 for USD & SDSM&T); and
 - b. Successful completion of coursework requirements
 - Four years of English
 - Three years of advanced mathematics
 - Three years of laboratory science
 - Three years of social studies
 - One year of fine arts
4. Take one of the assessments below and meet the required score(s):
 - a. 10th grade ACT Aspire Summative Assessment – (score 434 or higher)
 - b. Accuplacer (Sentence Skills – score 86 or higher AND Elementary Algebra – score 76 or higher)

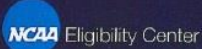

ONE OPPORTUNITY. LIMITLESS POSSIBILITIES.

If you want to play sports at an NCAA Division I or II school, start by registering for a Certification Account with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org. If you want to play Division III sports or you aren't sure where you want to compete, start by creating a Profile Page at eligibilitycenter.org.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

To play sports at a Division I or II school, you must graduate from high school, complete 16 NCAA-approved core courses, earn a minimum GPA and earn an ACT or SAT score that matches your core-course GPA.

CORE COURSES

Only courses that appear on your high school's list of NCAA core courses will count toward the 16 core-course requirement; visit eligibilitycenter.org/courseslist for a full list of your high school's approved core courses. Complete 16 core courses in the following areas:

DIVISION I

Complete 10 NCAA core courses, including seven in English, math or natural/physical science, before your seventh semester.



DIVISION II



GRADE-POINT AVERAGE

The NCAA Eligibility Center calculates your grade-point average based only on the grades you earn in NCAA-approved core courses.

- DI requires a minimum 2.3 GPA.
- DII requires a minimum 2.2 GPA.

SLIDING SCALE

Divisions I and II use sliding scales to match test scores and GPAs to determine eligibility. The sliding scale balances your test score with your GPA. If you have a low test score, you need a higher GPA to be eligible. Find more information about test scores at ncaa.org/test-scores.

TEST SCORES

You may take the SAT or ACT an unlimited number of times before you enroll full time in college. Every time you register for the SAT or ACT, use the NCAA Eligibility Center code 9999 to send your scores directly to us from the testing agency. We accept official scores only from the ACT or SAT, and won't use scores shown on your high school transcript. If you take either test more than once, the best subscore from different tests are used to give you the best possible score.



HIGH SCHOOL TIMELINE

9TH GRADE



- **Start planning now!** Take the right courses and earn the best grades possible.
- Find your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses at eligibilitycenter.org/courseslist.
- Sign up for a free Profile Page at eligibilitycenter.org for information on NCAA requirements.

10TH GRADE



- If you fall behind academically, ask your counselor for help finding approved courses you can take.
- Register for a Profile Page or Certification Account with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.
- Monitor your Eligibility Center account for next steps.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.

11TH GRADE



- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track to complete the required number of NCAA-approved courses and graduate on time with your class.
- Take the ACT or SAT and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Ensure your sports participation information is correct in your Eligibility Center account.
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor at each high school or program you attended to upload your official transcript to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.

12TH GRADE



- Complete your final NCAA-approved core courses as you prepare for graduation.
- Take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary, and submit your scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Request your final amateurism certification beginning April 1 (fall enrollees) or Oct. 1 (winter/spring enrollees) in your NCAA Eligibility Center account at eligibilitycenter.org.
- After you graduate, ask your counselor to upload your final official transcript with proof of graduation to your NCAA Eligibility Center account.
- **Reminder:** Only students on an NCAA Division I or II school's institutional request list will receive a certification.
