### FRENCHTOWN SCHOOL ACCREDITATION PROCESS - 2023-2024



School Districts across the state of Montana will be going through a three year accreditation process starting this school year. There are several components we will be working through; however, the focus at this time will be rolling out a Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA) Survey. Several stakeholder groups will be asked to take this survey that has been provided to school districts by the Montana Office of Public Instruction (OPI). Once the CNA has been taken by parents, students, staff members, board members, administration, and business partners, then we will analyze the results and then goals will be set based on the analysis of the survey results. One of the purposes of the CNA is to work on and through a Family and Community Engagement Plan as a component of an Integrated Strategic Action Plan.

### **HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHERS**

The following information is required by schools to be made available to parents by the state of Montana. We have to make available the qualifications of teachers in our district. A "highly qualified teacher" for Montana as defined by the Montana Office of Public Instruction is a teacher that is properly certified and endorsed in all areas of the teaching assignment. A parent may request the following information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers:

- Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction. (All of our teachers meet state qualifications or licensing criteria) (We do have one teacher that does not meet Montana qualifications, but does meet another state's standards and we are working on meeting the Montana state criteria)
- 2) Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- 3) The baccalaureate degree major of your child's teacher/s and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certificate or degree. (If you would like this information about any teacher your child has, please submit your request in writing to Les Meyer, Superintendent and this information will be provided)
- 4) Whether your child, if served in Title I, is being provided services by paraprofessionals and if so, their qualifications. (You can request this information in writing from Les Meyer, Superintendent)
