- This year we had a grant to cover all dual credit/early college classes. We are hoping to get that grant next year as well.
- Early Graduation

1. 3.0 GPA
2. Letter of intent to Principal in May of junior year
3. Must request government as a junior- you will be placed in the spring semester junior year
4. Take 1 extra semester of English your junior year or fall of senior year
5. Fall of Senior Year you will take 1 st semester of government and English- in addition to other credits needed
6. You must notify your counselor

## FACE <br> Frenchtown Academy for Career Education

- Applications due: April 1 to your counselor
- Selections will be made by May 1
- If you are trying to join FACE- still register like normal for the classes you would need next year
- If you are selected- we will change your schedule
- State Standards diploma
- 80\% attendance contract to walk in graduation
- No applicants will be added during the existing school year. You must apply a year in advance

## Montana's Rigorous Core Courses for Students

## and the MUS Honors Scholarship

- English: 4 credits
- Mathematics: 4 credits
- Science: 3 credits of Lab Science
- Social Studies: 3 credits
U.S. History (gr. 11) 1.0 credits, U.S. Government (gr. 12) 1.0 credits, Global Studies: 1.0 credits, Global Studies options include: World History (1.0), World Geog. Western (.5), World Geog. Eastern (.5)
- Electives -3 credits
- Alternate Option: 3 years of math including one course beyond Alg. Il, and four years of laboratory science may be substituted for the four years of math and three years of science.

The Rigorous Core courses prepare students for admission and success in the Montana University system and most other colleges and universities.
*The Montana Board of Regents of Higher Education has designated these courses as the Rigorous Core.

# College Sports NCAA 

We have all student athletes aim for NCAA Division 1 requirements. When they meet these they also qualify for NCAA Division II and III, NAIA, and NJCAA.

During junior year student athletes must register with NCAA and NAIA eligibility centers. There is a fee to register. NJCAA does not have an eligibility center

## DIVISION I - Eligibility Requirements

## 16 Core-Course Rule

- 16 Core Courses:
- 4 years of English.
- 3 years of mathematics
- 2 years of natural/physical science ( 1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- 1 year of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.

DIVISION I WORKSHEET



- 2 years of social science.
- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrínal religion/philosophy).


## Juniors- Non Credit Classes- up to 2 per semester

- Option 1-
- Work release will be removed if you are failing a class
- WORK RELEASE STUDENTS CANNOT STAY ON CAMPUSCannot stay in pods, in gym, or in a teacher's classroom
- 3 STRIKE RULE- If you are found on campus $3 x$ during your work release the work release will be removed from your schedule


## Non Credit Bearing

 ClassesJuniors can have 2 non-credit bearing classes.
Option 2- Elementary Aide- Sometimes paid positions

- Request Elementary Aide through the portal.
- You can only request 1 semester of elem aide through IC
- At the beginning of the year meet with Ms. Goris to find out your placement.
- Must have transportation to South Campus to be an elementary aide.

## Completing Junior Class Requests

-You need at least 6
credit-bearing classes per semester
You need at least 4 alternates

Juniors wanting work release, you may have up to two periods per semester- cannot stay on campus

- Use IC Portal to make requests February $26^{\text {th }}-3: 30$ p.m. on March $5^{\text {th }}$
- Check with teachers and request appropriate levels of courses - honors, AP etc.
- Must request at least 6 classes unless you want counselors to choose classes for you
