HONORS REQUIREMENTS

- ❖ ENROLLMENT IN ALL HONORS CLASSES IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS who have earned an “A” or “B” in classes offered by that specific academic department during the previous school term.
- ❖ You must take **at least 3 AP/Dual Credit classes** to earn high honors. Must have high honors for Valedictorian/Salutatorian
- ❖ You may not count the same honors credit twice.

- Parent and student meeting during fall conferences of Sophomore Year
- Application due late November sophomore year.
- Sophomore year courses- 2nd semester Biology and Business course
- Must have a 3.0 GPA to join
- 30 students will be selected to join
- Applicants selected based on GPA, Honors Courses, Behavior
- Complete 1 year of college while in High School
- 2nd semester Business 101 & 2nd Semester Discover Biology
- Must register for Honors Biology

MONTANA'S RIGOROUS CORE COURSES FOR STUDENTS AND THE MUS HONORS SCHOLARSHIP- FULL TUITION WAIVER

English: 4 credits

Mathematics: 4 credits

Including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II,

and one course above Algebra II

****All must have grades of "C" or better.**

Science: 3 credits of Lab Science

Social Studies: 3 credits

U.S. History (gr. 11) 1.0 credits, U.S. Government (gr. 12) 1.0 credits, Global Studies: 1.0 credits ,

Global Studies options include: World History (1.0), World Geog. Western (.5), World Geog. Eastern (.5)

Electives – 3 credits – Prefer 2 years of same foreign language

Alternate Option: 3 years of math including one course beyond Alg. II, and four years of laboratory science may be substituted for the four years of math and three years of science.

The Rigorous Core courses prepare students for admission and success in the Montana University system and most other colleges and universities.

***The Montana Board of Regents of Higher Education has designated these courses as the Rigorous Core.**

COMPLETING SOPHOMORE REGISTRATION

- ◆ You need 8 classes per semester
- ◆ Use 4 year plan to select classes and consider prerequisites
- ◆ You may only have 1 non-credit class per semester.
- ◆ If you would like a work release you may request only one per semester.
- ◆ MUST be off campus for work release. It will be removed from your schedule if you are failing a class.
- ◆ Use Infinite Campus portal to make requests by March 5th @ 3:30pm
- ◆ Check with teachers and request appropriate levels of courses – honors, AP etc.
- ◆ Request a class for all 8 periods per semester
- ◆ Request alternates
