Inclement Weather/School Closings

As a result of inclement weather, schools may:



- Open on time
- Delay start
- Close

When the temperature with WTCH/WOWN Radio Station is below -20°F, buses will leave two hours later and schools will start two hours later.

When the temperature is recorded at -25°F with WTCH/WOWN Radio Station, school will not be held. Wind chill warnings will be considered.

PARENTS — if school is open and you decide that weather conditions make it unsafe for your child/children to come to school, call the school to notify the office that they will not be in attendance and they will be excused.

Students' families will be notified, by building, via Skylert.

Updated contact information is necessary to receive timely notifications.

WTCH-96.1 FM & 960 AM, WOWN—99.3 FM, WJMQ 92.3 FM and WIXX—101.1 FM are called as soon as a decision is reached to place a closing announcement on the air.

FOX 11—TV (Channel 11) will announce the decision of school operations between 6:15 am and 8:00 am.

An announcement will be made when school is dismissed early due to inclement weather. Parents are asked to have alternate plans for their children's supervision and care in the event school is dismissed early due to inclement weather.

To schedule an appointment, call 715.201.9712 after January 3, 2024. Be prepared to leave a call back number. Pick up and complete intake forms from the Shawano County Library 128 S Sawyer St, Shawano, before your appointment.

- At the first appointment you will drop-off your completed intake forms, all supporting documents like W-2's and 1099 forms, rent certificate or property tax bill and present social security cards and photo ID for all taxpayers and dependents.
- At the second appointment you will get your completed tax return to review before e-filing. Expect this process to take 1-2 weeks.

Shawano County Human Services will also be offering Homestead Credit Clinics. This program is for people age 60 and older who qualify for Homestead Credit, but are not required to file a WI income tax return. To make an appointment call Heidi Russell at 715-526-4686.



Or you can file yourself with Myfreetaxes.com. This on-line tax preparation program is free to everyone. You will need an email address. The site does offer a help line to answer questions. Spanish returns available.



People with basic taxes often find tax filing overwhelming and need help.

Vita – Volunteer Income Tax Assistance – prepares and e-files tax returns for individuals and families with a household income under \$60,000.

Volunteers are needed to prepare basic returns. The tax software guides you through the process. Training is available. Hours are flexible to work around your schedule. Preparers are required to pass the IRS on-line test.

Don't feel ready to do returns? Volunteer greeters are also needed. Greeters welcome people to the tax site, assist them in filling out an intake questionnaire and help to organize the documents needed for their tax preparation. VITA tax sites are located in Shawano, Gillett, Pulaski and Keshena.






